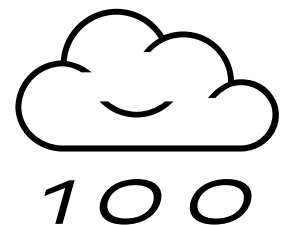

WAIVER AND RELEASE OF LIABILITY, ASSUMPTION OF RISK AND INDEMNITY AGREEMENT

For and in consideration of United States Equestrian Federation, Inc. dba US Equestrian ("USEF") allowing me, the undersigned, to participate in any capacity (including as a rider, driver, handler, vaulter, longeur, lessee, owner, agent, coach, official, trainer or volunteer) in a USEF sanctioned, licensed or approved event or activity, including but not limited to equestrian clinics, practices, shows, competitions and related or incidental activities and ("USEF Event" or "USEF Events"); I, for myself, and on behalf of my spouse, children, heirs and next of kin, and any legal and personal representatives, executors, administrators, successors, and assigns, hereby agree to and make the following contractual representations pursuant to this Agreement (the "Agreement"):

A. RULES AND REGULATIONS: I hereby agree that I have read, understand, and agree to be bound by all applicable Federation Bylaws, rules, and policies including the USEF Safe Sport Policy and Minor Athlete Abuse Prevention Policies (MAAPP) as published at www.usef.org, as amended from time to time.

B. ACKNOWLEDGMENT OF RISK: I knowingly, willingly, and voluntarily acknowledge the inherent risks associated with the sport of equestrian and know that horseback riding and related equestrian activities are inherently dangerous, and that participation in any USEF Event involves risks and dangers including, without limitation, the potential for serious bodily injury (including broken bones, head or neck injuries), sickness and disease (including communicable diseases), trauma, pain & suffering, permanent disability, paralysis and death; loss of or damage to personal property (including my mount & equipment) arising out of the unpredictable behavior of horses; exposure to extreme conditions and circumstances; accidents involving other participants, event staff, volunteers or spectators; contact or collision with other participants and horses, natural or manmade objects; adverse weather conditions; facilities issues and premises conditions; failure of protective equipment (including helmets); inadequate safety measures; participants of varying skill levels; situations beyond the immediate control of the USEF Event organizers and competition management; and other undefined, not readily foreseeable and presently unknown risks and dangers ("Risks").

EQUINE ACTIVITY LIABILITY ACT WARNING:

CAUTION: HORSEBACK RIDING AND EQUINE ACTIVITIES CAN BE DANGEROUS. RIDE AT YOUR OWN RISK.

Under the laws of most States, an equine activity sponsor or equine professional is not liable for any injury to, or the death of, a participant in equine activities resulting from the inherent risks of equine activities.

C. ASSUMPTION OF RISK: I understand that the aforementioned Risks may be caused in whole or in part or result directly or indirectly from the negligence of my own actions or inactions, the actions or inactions of others participating in the USEF Events, or the negligent acts or omissions of the Released Parties defined below, and I hereby voluntarily and knowingly assume all such Risks and responsibility for any damages, liabilities, losses, or expenses that I incur as a result of my participation in any USEF Events. I also agree to be responsible for any injury or damage caused by me, my horse, my employees or contractors under my direction and control at any USEF Event.

D. WAIVER AND RELEASE OF LIABILITY, HOLD HARMLESS AND INDEMNITY: In conjunction with my participation in any USEF Event, I hereby release, waive and covenant not to sue, and further agree to indemnify, defend and hold harmless the following parties: USEF, USEF Recognized Affiliate Associations, the United States Olympic & Paralympic Committee (USOPC), USEF clubs, members, Event participants (including athletes/riders, coaches, trainers, judges/officials, and other personnel), the Event owner, licensee, and competition managers; the promoters, sponsors, or advertisers of any USEF Event; any charity or other beneficiary which may benefit from the USEF Event; the owners, managers, or lessors of any facilities or premises where a USEF Event may be held; and all directors, officers, employees, agents, contractors, and volunteers of any of the aforementioned parties (**Individually and Collectively, the "Released Parties" or "Event Organizers"**), with respect to any liability, claim(s), demand(s), cause(s) of action, damage(s), loss, or expense (including court costs and reasonable attorney fees) of any kind or nature ("**Liability**") which may arise out of, result from, or relate in any way to my participation in the USEF Events, including claims for Liability caused in whole or in part by the negligent acts or omissions of the Released Parties.

E. COMPLETE AGREEMENT AND SEVERABILITY CLAUSE: This Agreement represents the complete understanding between the parties regarding these issues and no oral representations, statements or inducements have been made apart from this Agreement. If any provision of this Agreement is held to be unlawful, void, or for any reason unenforceable, then that provision shall be deemed severable from this Agreement and shall not affect the validity and enforceability of any remaining provisions.

I HAVE CAREFULLY READ THIS DOCUMENT IN ITS ENTIRETY, UNDERSTAND ALL OF ITS TERMS AND CONDITIONS, AND KNOW IT CONTAINS AN ASSUMPTION OF RISK, RELEASE AND WAIVER FROM LIABILITY, AS WELL AS A HOLD HARMLESS AND INDEMNIFICATION OBLIGATIONS.

By signing below, I (as the participant or as the Parent/Legal Guardian of the minor identified below) hereby accept and agree to the terms and conditions of this Agreement in connection with my (or the minor's) participation in any USEF Event. If, despite this Agreement, I, or anyone on my behalf or the minor's behalf, makes a claim for Liability against any of the Released Parties, I will indemnify, defend and hold harmless each of the Released Parties from any such Liabilities as the result of such claim.

The parties agree that this agreement may be electronically signed. The parties agree that the electronic signatures appearing on this agreement are the same as handwritten signatures for the purposes of validity, enforceability, and admissibility.

By entering a Federation-licensed Competition and signing this entry blank as the Owner, Lessee, Trainer, Manager, Agent, Coach, Driver, Rider, Handler, Vaultor or Longeur and on behalf of myself and my principals, representatives, employees and agents, I agree that I am subject to the Bylaws and Rules of The United States Equestrian Federation, Inc. (the "Federation") and the local rules of _____ (Competition). I agree to be bound by the Bylaws and Rules of the Federation and of the competition. I will accept as final the decision of the Hearing Committee on any question arising under the Rules, and agree to release and hold harmless the competition, the Federation, their officials, directors and employees for any action taken under the Rules. I represent that I am eligible to enter and/or participate under the Rules, and every horse I am entering is eligible as entered. I also agree that as a condition of and in consideration of acceptance of entry, the Federation and/or the Competition may use or assign photographs, videos, audios, cable - casts, broadcasts, internet, film, new media or other likenesses of me and my horse taken during the course of the competition for the promotion, coverage or benefit of the competition, sport, or the Federation. Those likenesses shall not be used to advertise a product and they may not be used in such a way as to jeopardize amateur status. I hereby expressly and irrevocably waive and release any rights in connection with such use, including any claim to compensation, invasion of privacy, right of publicity, or to misappropriation. The construction and application of Federation rules are governed by the laws of the State of New York, and any action instituted against the Federation must be filed in New York State. See GR908.4.

Horse show entries are FREE for Thoroughbreds (OTTBs) and young horses (6 and under) at select Temecula Valley National Horse Shows. Young Hunter class fees waived all weeks. Thoroughbreds must be tattooed and USEF age verification is required for young horses. Exhibitors are fully responsible for all additional charges, such as office, stall, feed and bedding, and USEF fees.

NOTE: Complimentary classes are limited to five (5) classes per horse. Markel/USHJA Zone 10 Jumper Team Championship is excluded.

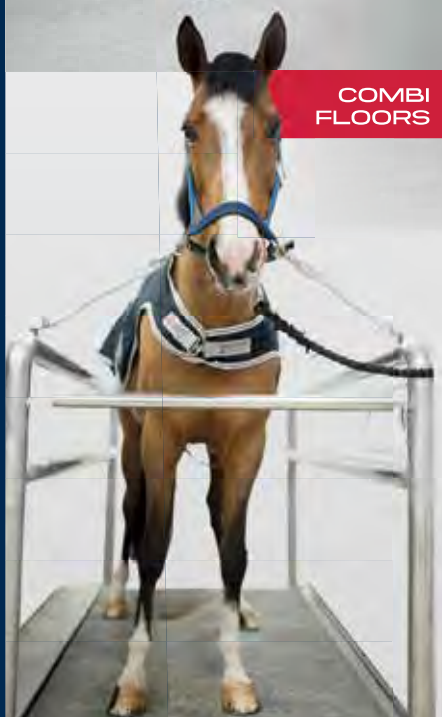

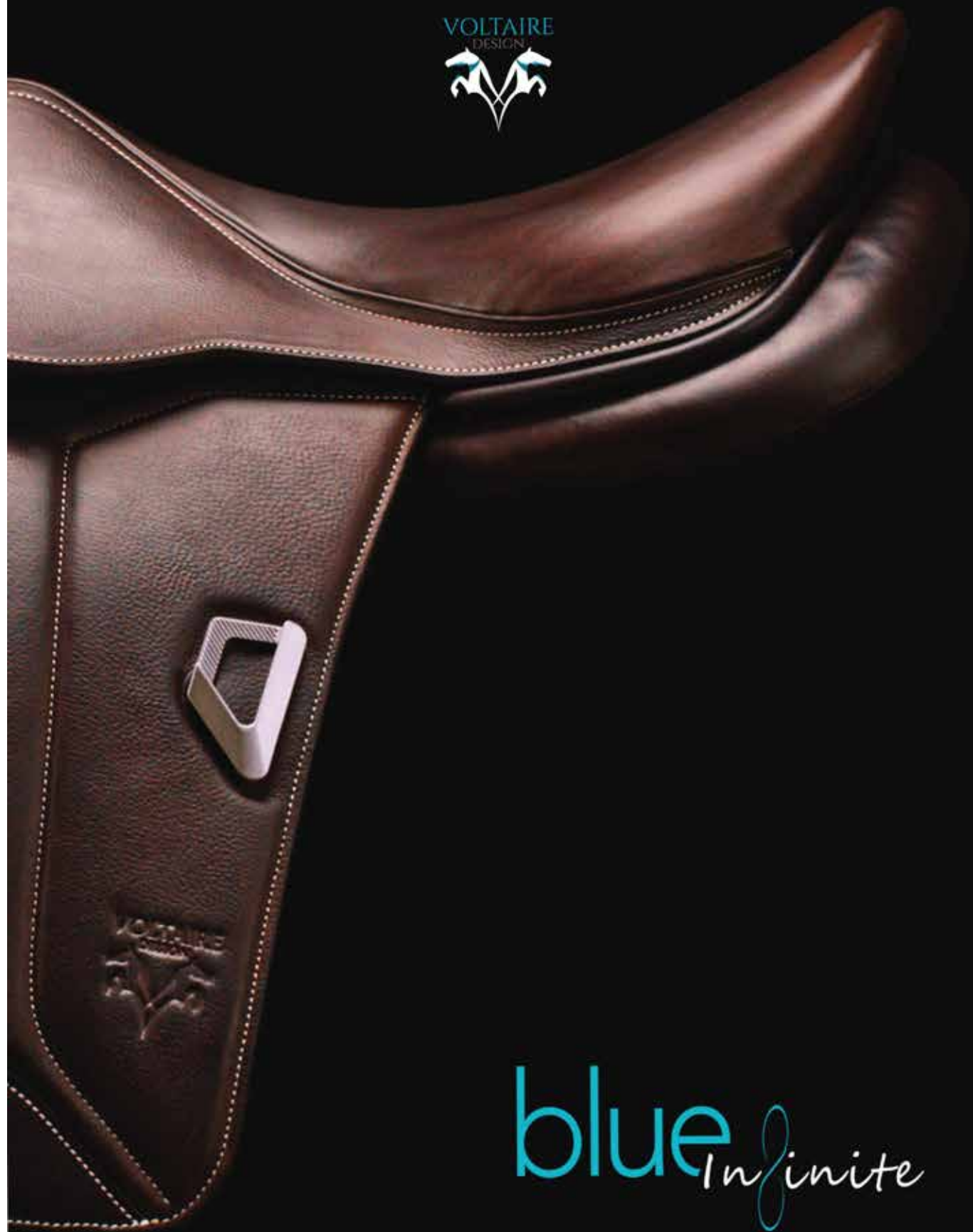

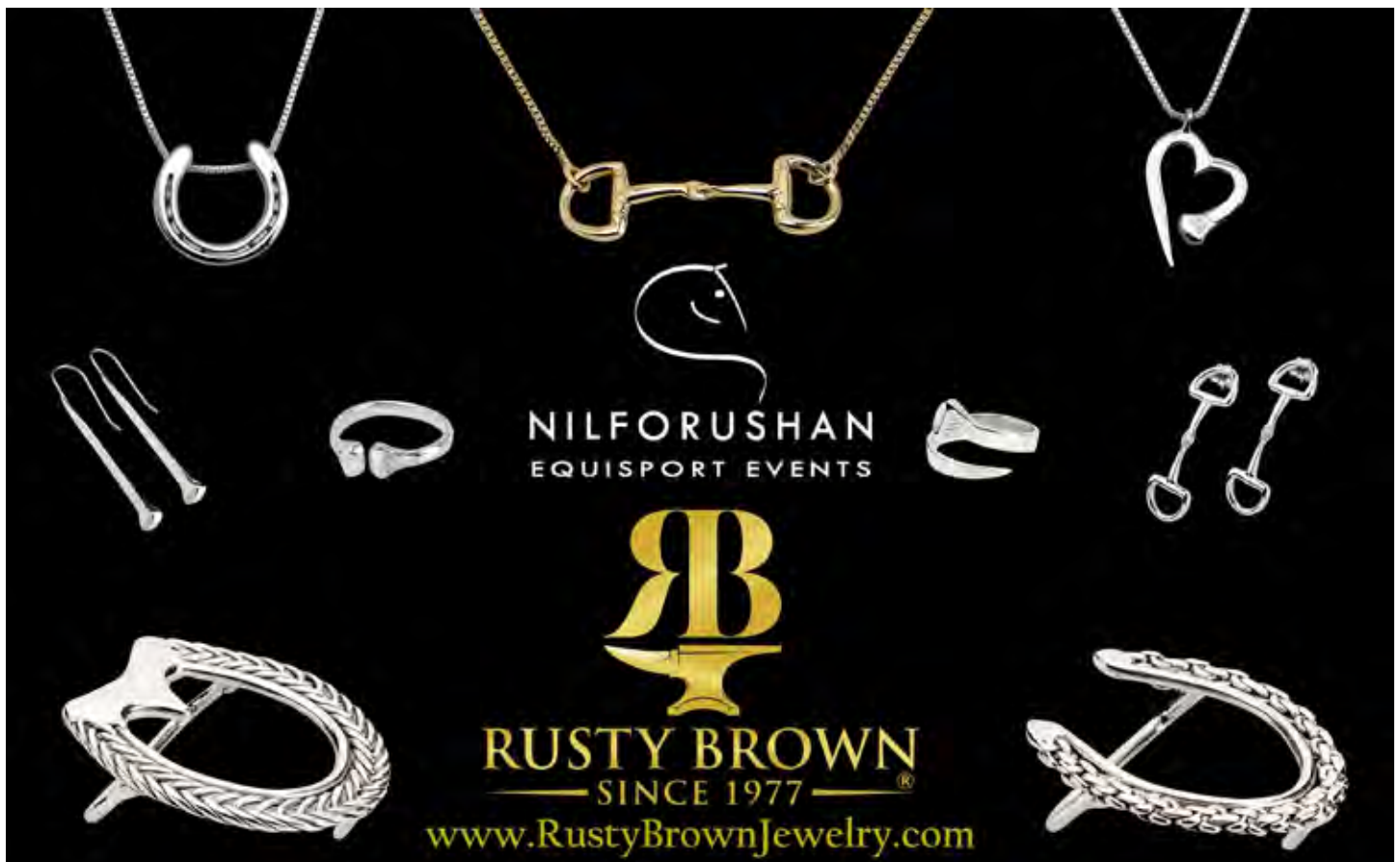

 - a. Each horse must be presented with its entry number and current Coggins and or passport (USEF proof of horse registration). Following the horse inspection, the assigned back number must always accompany the horse when it is out of its stall and must be visible on the stall door when in the stall.
 - b. Horses not accepted at the horse inspection will have the opportunity to be represented once, prior to the First Individual Qualifying Class.
 - c. If a horse is not accepted at the initial horse inspection the horse may not participate in the ZJTC Training Session if it is held prior to the re-inspection. Horses not accepted at the re-inspection will not compete in the ZJTC. Horses may not participate in any concurrently held competition during which the ZJTC is held 48 hours following the horse inspection. (GR914.3)

 - a. Boot regulations- Refer to rule JP111.5.

Athlete Rules and Regulations

1. Although an athlete is not prevented from competing on another horse during the ZJTC week there will be no waiting for that athlete/horse during the ZJTC classes. If an athlete is not immediately available in the order, the athlete will be scratched from that ZJTC class.
2. Failure to enter the ring within one minute of being called incurs elimination. The time limit for entering the ring must be enforced by management. (JP137)
3. Only the competing athlete may be mounted on the ZJTC horse after the official Horse Inspection.
4. Riders' meeting: There will be a mandatory riders' meeting and Show Jumping Athlete Pathway Orientation presentation: The time and location will be included in the prize list and schedule.
5. The draw for the Team Order of Go will take place at the Riders' Meeting.
6. Teams will be determined two weeks prior to the ZJTC and are subject to change should a member of a team scratch. All necessary changes will be communicated to the Zone Chefs d'Equipe.
7. To hold a ZJTC, a minimum of three teams must be entered in each section or combined section. Teams may be combined by sections or height and /or combined section, height, and zone. A. Schooling

USEF Jumper Schooling Rules will be in effect throughout the competition (JP 103 and Appendix A).

Attire (JP 111.9)1. Official Horse Inspection and Course Walks

- a. Athletes and or designated representatives must be appropriately dressed. Athletes must wear boots, breeches, and a helmet. A designated representative must be professionally dressed and wearing a helmet and proper footwear for the Official Horse Inspection. Please refer to USEF rule JP 111.9c.
2. First Individual Qualifier and Team Competition
 - a. White breeches: and zone team shirts are encouraged. Shirts must have collars and sleeves (sleeves may be long or short) and must be tucked into breeches. Sleeveless shirts and shirts with exposed hoods are prohibited. If team shirts are not available, athletes must follow the Formal Attire dress code. (JP 111.9a)

ALL EXHIBITORS: Parents or guardians of minor exhibitors (juniors) and all adults shall hold Nilforushan Equisport Events, Galway Downs, vendors, exhibitors, and employees harmless for injury, illness or death. No entry will be accepted without the signature of parent or guardian on the entry form. The signatures of instructors, agents, or other unrelated persons will not be accepted.

"EVERY CLASS OFFERED HEREIN WHICH IS COVERED BY THE RULES AND SPECIFICATIONS OF THE CURRENT USEF RULEBOOK WILL BE CONDUCTED AND JUDGED IN ACCORDANCE THEREWITH."

CONDITIONS OF COMPETITION

Eventing Competitions at the Modified Level or above, Combined Driving Competitions at the Advanced Level, Dressage Competitions, Endurance Rides and Vaulting Competitions: (See GR828.4 of the Federation rules). Life, senior active and junior active members shall be eligible to participate in all classes at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions at the Modified Level or above and Combined Driving Competitions at the Advanced Level, Dressage, Reining and Vaulting Competitions and Endurance Rides. A non-member may participate as a handler, rider, driver, owner, lessee, or agent, at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions, Dressage Competitions, Reining Competitions and Combined Driving Competitions upon payment of a Show Pass fee. Participants in the following classes are exempted from the Requirements of this rule: 1) leadline; 2) exhibitions; 3) games and races; 4) classes for 4-H members; 5) walk trot (exception: Friesian performance FR231) and academy classes (academy classes are classes limited to horses used regularly in a lesson program); 6) USDF introductory level tests, pas de deux and quadrille classes; 7) NRHA Endorsed Reining Competitions. 8) Opportunity classes, 9) citizens of other nations who have proof, in English, of current membership in good standing of their own National Federation, 10) USEA beginner novice division; and 11) assistant handlers in Dressage Sport Horse Breeding classes.

USEF ENTRY AGREEMENT

By entering a Federation-licensed Competition and signing this entry blank as the Owner, Lessee, Trainer, Manager, Agent, Coach, Driver, Rider, Handler, Vaultor or Longeur and on behalf of myself and my principals, representatives, employees and agents, I agree that I am subject to the Bylaws and Rules of The United States Equestrian Federation, Inc. (the "Federation") and the local rules of the competition. I agree to be bound by the Bylaws and Rules of the Federation of The United States Equestrian Federation and of the competition. I will accept as final the decision of the Hearing Committee on any question arising under the Rules, and agree to release and hold harmless the competition, the Federation, their officials, directors and employees for any action taken under the Rules. I represent that I am eligible to enter and/or participate under the rules, and every horse I am entering is eligible as entered. I also agree that as a condition of and in consideration of acceptance of entry, the Federation and/or the competition may use or assign photographs, videos, audios, cablecasts, broadcasts, internet, film, news media or other likenesses of me and

my horse taken during the course of the competition for the promotion, coverage or benefit of the competition, sport, or the Federation. Those likenesses shall not be used to advertise a product and they may not be used in such a way as to jeopardize amateur status. I hereby expressly and irrevocably waive and release any rights in connection with such use, including any claim to compensation, invasion of privacy, right of publicity, or to misappropriation. The construction and application of Federation rules are governed by the laws of the State of New York, and any action instituted against the Federation must be filed in New York State. See GR 908.4.

The Horse Show Committee reserves the right to itself to interpret all questions and conditions in regard to or arising out of, or incident to the show without claims for damages or recourse of any kind. All questions not covered in these Rules and Regulations shall be decided by the Horse Show Management; its decision to be final.

The Horse Show Management reserves to itself the right to limit entries in any class, section or division, to refuse, accept conditionally, or to cancel any entries, disqualify any riders or exhibitors, prohibit exhibition of entries, and cancel award prizes, without any claim for damages; to change any course, to add a dotted line, to cancel or combine any unfilled classes, or to reschedule classes, after due notice to exhibitors; to change rings or rotate judges; to change specifications in jumper classes as competition warrants.

Every horse entered herein for competition will be under the control of the Horse Show Management, but the Show Management will in no case be responsible for any loss or damage that may occur, and it shall be a condition of entry that each exhibitor shall hold the horse show and the officials, employees, directors, officers, sponsoring entities of the horse show and the facilities at which the horse show is held blameless for any loss or accident to his horse(s), employee(s), or equipment which may occur from sickness, fire or other cause.

ENTRY CLOSING DATE: Must be RECEIVED by date indicated on entry blank.

A 3% charge will be added to all fees paid by credit card.

ENTRY PROCEDURE

- Fees must be paid using a credit card. No cash or checks will be accepted.

- The Horse Show policies herein stated regarding scratches and refunds will be followed regardless of weather and in place of GR 912.
- Receipt of any entry form to NEE, whether bearing signature or not, will constitute an entry and will be subject to the Rules and Regulations of this prize list.
- Accounts that are not closed out by Monday following each show week by 5:00pm will incur a \$75 late close-out fee.
- **RETURNED CHECKS/CHARGEBACKS:** Checks returned by the bank or Credit card chargebacks for any reason are regarded as a most serious offense and will be handled according to the following procedure: A \$50 penalty will be assessed for each returned check or chargeback OR 10% of the face value of the check or chargeback, whichever is greater. ENTRY CLARIFICATION

- Classes may only be entered or declared by using a Class Number. A Class Number written on the Entry Form, Add/Scratch Form, or Barn Add/Scratch Form constitutes a Class Entry or Class Declaration.
- An entry with incomplete information for horse, owner, rider or trainer such as a horse entered as "Entry" or "TBA" or any such derivative, will be subject to the \$75 Incomplete Entry Fee. An entry with missing USEF/USHJA numbers or signatures is also subject to this fee.
- Equitation riders must ride the horse and wear the number of the horse they have entered to ride. There is no penalty for the rider to scratch an equitation class from one horse and add it on another horse. For a flat fee of \$125 all exhibitors during each week of the Temecula Valley National Horse Show will receive every single photograph taken of them competing in a low-resolution format perfect for posting on social media, as well as access to a library of horse show videos on www.jump-nee.com. This will allow riders to watch their rounds from classes in every ring and share photos to relive horse show memories with friends and family.

SERVICES

- **Feed Store:** Hay, grain and bedding may be purchased on the grounds. For deliveries prior to or upon arrival, order on ShowGroundsLive.com or use the online form at Jump-NEE.com. Place orders by noon for same-day delivery. Questions with regard to feed and bedding charges will not be considered after noon on Friday. Discrepancies in deliveries will not be considered unless brought to the attention of the Feed Office within 24 hours of placing the order.
- **Manure Removal Fee:** \$35 per horse. Fee applied if minimum of 5 bags of shavings are not ordered.
- **Trainer's Splits:** This service allows trainers to split the show charges for miscellaneous items to their clients. Splits will be accepted until noon Friday. Only items billed by the horse show such as feed, bedding, tack stalls, etc., will be split. Only dollar amounts will be split and totals will be rounded up. Splits will revert back to the trainer for payment if uncollected.
- **Exhibitor Check Cashing:** is not available Please make arrangements with local banks.

CREDIT CARDS

- A declined credit card will be resubmitted within several days.
- A closed account, stop payment, incorrect or incomplete credit card information or a charge back will be turned over to sanctioning organizations immediately.
- A 3% Retail Adjustment will be applied to all Credit Card transactions.

PRIZE MONEY

- Prize Money is issued to the Owner, or if provided, the "Recipient of Prize Money" recorded on the entry form. A valid Social Security or Federal ID number must be provided. If the IRS has notified us of a discrepancy in Payee name or SSN / EIN, prize money will be withheld until the discrepancy is resolved. Checks will be mailed or hand-delivered within 30 days after the Show.
- Prize Money Won by Foreign Exhibitors is subject to the US Internal Revenue Service regulation requiring sporting events to withhold 30% of prize money. Foreign exhibitors should apply for a Social Security number and will be asked to complete Form W-8BEN prior to receiving prize money.
- Add Back Prize Money is computed from the number of horses that actually show. Horses entered but not shown forfeit the add back money.
- Prize money is awarded through 8th place in Hunter classes and Classics. Prize money is awarded to 8th place in all jumper classes and Classics, other than classes with prize money of \$20,000 or higher.
- Hunter Class/Classic Pay Out: 30%, 22%, 15%, 10%, 7%, 6%, 5%, 5%
- Jumper Class/Classic Pay Out: 30%, 22%, 15%, 10%, 7%, 6%, 5%, 5%
- Grand Prix and other classes with prize money of \$20,000 and greater: 30%, 22%, 13%, 8%, 6%, 5%, 4%, 3%, 3%, 2%, 2%, 2%
- For all jumper classes offering more than \$500 in prize money, the last place must at least equal the start fee.

ASSOCIATION MEMBERSHIP REQUIREMENTS

- **Owner-Rider-Trainer:** Must be members of USEF and USHJA, or pay Show Pass fees.
- **Adult or Amateur Status:** Riders showing in classes restricted to Adults or Amateurs must have USEF Amateur Certification.
FOREIGN EXHIBITOR ASSOCIATION REQUIREMENTS:
- **Owner, Rider, Trainer:** Must provide proof in writing (English) that they are a member in good standing of their national federation.
- **Junior, Amateur or Adult Status:** Riders showing in classes restricted to Junior, Amateur or Adults present their membership card or other documentation indicating their Junior or Amateur status. Amateurs must provide or sign for USEF Amateur Status. Foreign Amateur Riders must join USEF and Sign for Amateur Status. Exception: Member of EC must sign for Amateur Status but need not join.
- **Horse/Pony Measurement Card:** Horse/Ponies showing in Junior Hunter, Pony Hunter, Children's Pony Hunter or Pony Jumpers must have a USEF Measurement card or be measured at the show. Foreign measurement cards are not acceptable as proof of measurement.

ASSOCIATION HORSE REQUIREMENTS

- Horse Fee: USEF \$8, USHJA \$2
- Horse Drug Fee: CDFA \$14, USEF \$15.
- High Performance Fees: Horses entered in Grand Prix are required to pay the \$35 IHP Fee up to a total of the cap of \$420 per competition year. Please refer to the USEF website for additional information.
- Horse/Pony Measurement Card: Junior Hunters, Pony Hunters, Children's Pony Hunters, and Pony Jumpers must have a valid USEF Measurement Card or copy of a valid Measurement Form, or be measured.
- Official Measurements are available at the show, to be held every Friday at 3:00pm. Please sign up in the show office.
- USEF Horse Recording: Horses must be Recorded with USEF Annually or for Life in order to be eligible for HOTY Awards and/or Zone Awards.
- USHJA Horse Registrations: All horses competing in USEF licensed Hunter/Jumper/Eq competitions must have or obtain a Registration Number from USHJA. PRESENTATION OF CREDENTIALS: THE SHOW SECRETARY WILL NOT ISSUE A NUMBER TO ANY EXHIBITOR UNTIL ASSOCIATION REQUIREMENTS HAVE BEEN MET. ONCE THE NUMBER IS ISSUED, ASSOCIATION FEES, INCLUDING SHOW PASS, WILL NOT BE ADJUSTED FOR THAT SHOW. Failure to provide proper credentials will result in show pass fees and/or Incomplete Entry fees charged in each incident. NOTE: The Exhibitor has the ultimate responsibility for proper registration of horse, owner, rider and trainer with USEF / USHJA and for entering the horse under proper ownership where points are concerned.
- Membership: Present to the Show Secretary proof of current membership, join at the show, or pay Show Pass fees.
- Horse Recording: Present to the Show Secretary proof of USHJA or apply at the Show. Horses must be Recorded with USEF Annually or for Life in order to be eligible for HOTY Awards and/or Zone Awards and to compete in a Grand Prix.
- Horse/Pony Measurement Card: Present to the Show Secretary proof of Measurement or have horse/pony measured at the Show.

FACILITY INFORMATION

- Footing at Galway Downs is all-weather.
- Ring sizes may change from show week to show week and notice will be posted in the Show Office.
- Food Service will be available every day.
- Lunging will be allowed in the designated areas only. Lunging is also allowed in the Grand Prix Warm Up and Hunter 1/2 Warm Up until 7am daily.

HEALTH & VETERINARY

- Sharps & Medical Waste must be placed in the proper receptacles. Anyone found in violation shall be subject to a fine or other penalties deemed necessary by Show Management.
- Show Veterinarian is in residence on the show grounds. The Vet's phone number will be posted at the Show Office.
- Equine Health Requirements will be enforced. All horses (competing or not) that enter the grounds are required to present the Required Health Entry Requirements, including the Event Participation Declaration and Proof of Vaccination. All horses are subject to examination by NEE officials/designated representatives and/or state officials (collectively "officials") for determining whether such animals are, have been infected/exposed, or are likely to become infected with an infectious or contagious disease. If after such examination, officials have reason to believe that an animal's health condition places other animals at risk, such officials, at their sole discretion, may quarantine such animal (and others that may have been infected/exposed) or, if appropriate, require that such animals be transported off the grounds. All participants agree to fully cooperate with event officials and abide by their decisions and instructions. Failure to comply shall be grounds for immediate expulsion and potential disciplinary action by organization, state/local or federal animal health officials. All exhibitors are encouraged to review the equine health entry/transport requirements of the destination state prior to entry. Additional information can be obtained from the State Vet Office.

SAFETY

Accidents Involving Competitors. GR1317. In the event of a head injury due to a fall/accident at a licensed competition, the competitor may be prohibited from further competition until released by medical personnel. In some cases, the competitor may not return to competition without a signed release from a licensed medical professional. The competitor may be placed on suspension by USEF until this criteria is met. Competitors are advised to familiarize themselves with this new rule.

- **Protective Headgear:** It is compulsory for all persons at Federation licensed hunter, jumper or hunter/jumper competitions in all Hunter, Jumper and Hunt Seat Equitation classes, when mounted anywhere on the competition grounds, to wear properly fastened protective headgear which meets or exceeds ASTM (American Society for Testing and Materials)/SEI (Safety Equipment Institute) standards for equestrian use and carries the SEI tag. It must be properly fitted with harness secured. It is the responsibility of the rider, or the parent or guardian or trainer of the junior exhibitor to see to it that the headgear worn complies with appropriate safety standards for protective headgear intended for equestrian use, and is properly fitted and in good condition, and the Federation, Show Committee and Licensed Official are not responsible for checking headgear worn for such compliance. GR 801.2,7.
- **Minors who do not have a valid driver's license** which allows them to operate a motorized vehicle in the state in which they reside will not be permitted to operate a motorized vehicle of any kind, including, but not limited to, golf carts, motorcycles, scooters, or farm utility vehicles, on the competition grounds of licensed competitions. Minors who have a valid temporary license may operate the above described motorized vehicles as long as they are accompanied by an adult with a valid driver's license. The parent/legal guardian or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating a motorized vehicle in violation of this rule are solely responsible for any damages, claims, losses or actions resulting from that operation. Violations of this rule will be cause for penalties against those responsible for the child committing the offense. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.

The unsafe use of personal electronic transport devices, as determined by the competition officials and management in their sole discretion, that do not require a driver's license to operate, including but not limited to segways, hover boards, and single wheeled scooters is prohibited on competition grounds. Operating such devices in areas where people gather may be deemed "unsafe use" if there is a risk of harm to others. If the operator of the device is a minor, the parent/legal guardian or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating the device in violation of this rule is accountable and may be subject to penalties. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.

- **Dogs must be restrained on the show grounds:** Loose dogs will be picked up and detained and the owner fined \$100. The owner may be barred from showing and expelled from the show grounds for a second offense, or for refusal to pay the fine, and will not

be entitled to any refund of entry or stabling fees paid or due. Management reserves the right to call Animal Control to have an animal removed from the premises.

- **Electrical/Fire Regulations:** Electrical installation and connections must meet all state and county codes. Aisles shall be maintained clear for a minimum of six feet wide by eight feet high. No obstructions or projections shall be allowed in these aisles. No Class I Flammable Liquids such as gasoline are allowed inside the buildings. Cooking is not permitted within any stable area. Anyone found in violation shall be subject to dismissal from further participation in the horse show without recourse. Additional appliances are not permitted within any stable area. Anyone found in violation shall be subject to confiscation of the item(s).
- **Exterior Tent alterations** are strictly forbidden. The removal of stall tent side poles, side ropes and/or stakes/anchors is strictly prohibited. Any exhibitor found in violation will be issued a single warning. If violation continues, Management reserves the right to remove from the show grounds all property belonging to or under the control of said violator. Further, Management reserves the right to bar any exhibitor found to be in violation from any further participation in the horse show without recourse to any refund of entry or stabling fees paid or due.
- **Damage:** Owners and exhibitors shall be held responsible for damage caused by them, their agents or employees to stalls, buildings and other properties on the show grounds, and shall be billed accordingly.
- **Alcoholic Beverages** in any form may not be brought onto the show grounds.

DIRECTIONS

From I-15, exit 79 South toward Indio and head East on Temecula Pkwy. Turn Left on Los Caballos Rd. Turn right on Los Corralitos. Look for "Equestrian Entrance".

SAFE SPORT

Reminder: All USEF Life and Senior Active members, as well as participants who have regular contact with minor athletes, are required to comply with the U.S. Center for SafeSport training requirement to be eligible to participate in the competition. All participants must adhere to the U.S. Center for SafeSport Code, USEF Safe Sport Policy, and the Minor Athlete Abuse Prevention Policies. GENERAL

Poling: Poling is prohibited in the State of California.

Entries May Close: Trainers and Exhibitors are advised that Management may elect to exercise its right to close entries for certain classes. Exhibitors are advised to keep this in mind when submitting their original Entry Form.

Show Weeks May Close: Exhibitors are advised that some show weeks may sell out. After the Closing Date of Entries, priority is given to exhibitors who enter two or more show weeks.

Awards: Ribbons will be awarded for 1st-8th placings.

International Riders: All classes held will be run under National rules with regard to riders with the exception of the FEI classes, when applicable. If the capacity of International riders exceeds the National riders rule, riders will be accepted on a 1st come, 1st served basis.

HUNTERS

General: All classes in rated hunter divisions will be judged on performance and soundness and when indicated, conformation, suitability or manners.

Jog: The following sections will not jog: Schooling, Low, Young, Adult, Children's, Short Stirrup, Long Stirrup, Cross Rails, and Green Rider. In divisions where horses are required to jog, horses are expected to circle on a loose rein to prove soundness.

Hunter Champion and Reserve: Awarded to two of the four horses scoring the most points over fences. In addition, only these will receive full points for ribbons won under saddle and half points for ribbons won in the model. In case of a tie, the horse who earned more points over fences wins the championship.

Warm-Up: Complimentary Warm up on on day prior to start of the show from 9 AM - 5 PM in our sand hunter arenas.

2023 Zone 10 Specifications: (Check [USHJA.org](https://www.ushja.org) for the most updated specs.)

- **Adult Hunters:** Horses and ponies. Horses or riders may not cross enter into any A-O Hunter Class, except the U/S. Riders may not cross enter into Green 3'6", Green 3'9" or High Performance at the same show. Riders may not cross enter into any class at the same show with fences exceeding 3'3" except Adult Jumpers, Jr/Am Mod Jumpers, Equitation and Medal Classes. Fences 3', spreads not to exceed fence height.

- **Children's Hunters:** Horses and ponies. Horses/Ponies or riders may not cross enter into any 3'6" Jr. Hunter Class, except the U/S. Riders may not cross enter into Green Hunter 3'6", Green Hunter 3'9" or High Performance at the same show. Riders may not cross enter into any class at the same show with fences exceeding 3'3" except Child Jumpers, Jr/Am Mod Jumpers, Eq. and Medal Classes. Exception: Riders in Child Hunter Pony may only cross enter into Children's Jumper. Fences 3', spreads not to exceed fence height. If Child Hunter Pony is offered, fences must be set at 2' for small/mediums and 2'6" for larges.
- **Green Hunter 3' & 3'3":** A horse of any age in its first or second year of showing over fences 3' to 3'3", and that has never shown over fences 3'6" or higher. Fences 3' or 3'3". Horses may not cross enter into 3'6" divisions. Refer to HU106.3 for additional information.
- **Hunters General:** Spreads not to exceed fence height. No jog.

JUMPERS

Jumper Nomination Fee: \$100

Nominated Jumper Sections: 1.20m – 1.45m, Grand Prix, Amateur, and Junior Jumper.

Non-Nominated Jumper Sections: .70m-1.15m, Adult, and Children's.

Jumper Champion and Reserve: Classics will not count towards Champion and Reserve Champion. However, in case of a tie, the placing in the corresponding Classic will break all ties. For nominated jumpers, money won will determine Champion and Reserve.

Eligibility: Any horse, regardless of winnings, is eligible to enter any .70m-1.45m and Open Jumper class.

Declarations: Nominated Jumpers must declare on the appropriate form in the Show Office by 4 pm the day before the class is to be held. Late declarations will be subject to the Post Entry Penalty and may require the horse to work first or last in the order of go at management's discretion. Classes may be scratched the day of prior to the class starting with no penalty - exception: Special Classes. Classes entered on the Entry Blank constitute a Declaration.

Jumper Tables: Refer to the Time Schedule.

Time Allowed: The Time Allowed will be based on a speed of 382 yards per minute for all sections unless otherwise noted, and may be adjusted accordingly.

Martingales: 1.30m or below: No martingale restrictions when used in a conventional manner. Draw Rein/German Martingales: allowed when schooling or in classes 1.20m or below that do not offer prize money. Above 1.30m (and all classes restricted to young horses): Only running martingales used in the conventional manner. Note: Ponies may not be ridden by a Junior in draw reins or German martingales at any time.

Ties: Ties involving first place will be jumped off. Ties not involving first place will be decided upon time unless otherwise stated.

CONDITIONS & SPECS (CONTINUED)

24 Hour Rule: Horses must be stabled on the grounds 24 hours prior to any class with prize money of \$25,000 or more. 2023 Zone 10 Specifications: (Check [USHJA.org](https://www.ushja.org) for the most updated specs.)

- **Children's and Adult Jumpers:** Horses or riders may not cross enter into any Junior or Amateur-Owner Jumper class at the same show. Exception: Low Junior and Amateur-Owner Jumper at Seaside Equestrian Tour, where fence height is 3'11". Riders may not cross enter into any Jumper class at the same show with fences exceeding 1.20m (3'11"). Fences 1.0m-1.05m (3'3"-3'5") for Low. Fences 1.10m (3'7") in the first class, 1.10m-1.15m (3'7"-3'9") in succeeding classes for High.

SPECIAL CLASSES

The General Rules and Regulations of the Horse Show will prevail for the Special Classes except as provided for each individual class and as noted herein.

National Standard Grand Prix -

- 1.45m - 1.50m with spreads to 1.70m, excluding Triple Bar and the first fence on course. At least 4 Verticals and 2 Oxers must be set at 1.50m. The maximum spread for the Triple Bar is 2.00m.
- **Specs:** Table II.2.a. National Standard.
- **Horse Limit:** Riders are not limited to the number of horses they may ride.

Special Hunter Classics: Judged on performance and soundness with manners and suitability emphasized. To be scored under the open numerical judging system. The top 12 (or 1/3) horses (ponies) from the first round will return to jump a second round in reverse order of their

scores in the first round; lowest score going first and highest score going last. In case of ties, order of those tied will be drawn. Scores will be averaged from both rounds to determine the winners. In case of a tie for first place only, judges will confer to break the tie. All other ties will remain and riders will toss a coin for the ribbons.

- **Separate Two Round Classic** - For the first round, each competitor will jump one round of approximately 10-12 fences at the required height.
- **Designated First Round Classic** - A designated class of the Division will be the first round of the Classic. You must enter the Classic prior to the start of the first round class. Scratches are not permitted after the First round class has begun. See Time Schedule for Designated First round class.

Special Class Nomination/Declaration: Special Classes added on the day of or after the Order of Go has been drawn will be required to work first in the order.

Special Class Scratch: Any scratch must be made before the class starts. See Rules & Regulations for more information.

- **Classics / Grand Prix:** In the event of scratch on the day of the class, horses are subject to the Classic / Grand Prix Scratch Fee.

Order of Go: The Order of Go will be drawn. In the jump-off, if any, all horses will go in the original drawn order

Attire: Formal attire required in Special Classes.

Awards: Winners to ride for presentation of awards in Special Classes.

Trophy & Ribbons: Ribbons will be awarded for 1st-10th placings.

Show Champion or Circuit Champion: Classics will not count toward Show or Circuit Champion



Equine Health Entry Requirements

Protecting the health of your horse and other horses at the Temecula Valley National Horse Show is of the utmost importance to Nilforushan Equisport Events. We are implementing Required Biosecurity Measures to decrease the risk of introduction and/or spread of contagious or infectious disease at our shows.

Horses must arrive only between the hours of 8 am - 5 pm daily. Off-hours arrival must obtain permission from Show Management 24 hours prior to arrival.

UPON ARRIVAL TO GALWAY DOWNS, ALL HORSES MUST HAVE/PROVIDE:

TRAINER DECLARATION OF HEALTH (REQUIRED):

Trainer must sign the Trainer Health Declaration form to confirm that all horses entering the show grounds have been in good health with no sign of infectious disease and have not had a fever above 101.5°F within the last 14 days. Signing these forms confirms that the horses listed are not demonstrating any signs of EHV-1 or Vesicular Stomatitis, have not had any known exposure to EHV-1 or Vesicular Stomatitis in 21 days, and are not coming from a property with known EHV-1 or Vesicular Stomatitis positive cases.

USEF VACCINATION RECORD (REQUIRED):

The USEF Vaccination Record form must be completed. The following information must be included: date of vaccination, place of vaccination, vaccine name, vaccine batch, and vaccine route mode. Form must be signed and stamped by attending veterinarian.

Within 6 months (180 days) of each show: **Equine Influenza**

Within 6 months (180 days) of each show: **EHV 1 and EHV 4**

If a vaccination will expire during one of the shows, the horse must receive its new vaccination prior to being issued a competition number for that show.

3 DAY TEMPERATURE LOG (REQUIRED):

A 3 day temperature log, with temperatures taken twice per day, must be submitted for each horse 24 hours prior to arrival.

TIMED CERTIFICATE OF VETERINARY INSPECTION (CVI) (REQUIRED):

To be issued within 5 days of entry to competition grounds. Only state-issued/approved official CVI documents shall be accepted. A VS statement must be included.

PRESENTATION OF HEALTH REQUIREMENTS (REQUIRED):

The Equine Health Requirements are Required for all horses entering the Show Grounds both Showing and Non-Showing. These documents must be in the Show Office before any competition numbers will be issued. In addition, random checks for Equine Health Requirements will occur. Be sure to keep a copy of all of your horse's Equine Health Requirements in an easily accessible spot (in your tack room or tack trunk, truck or trailer) to ensure you can comply with this requirement. The results on all required papers must indicate the horse's registered (show) name.

Any horse not accompanied by these documents will be directed to the Show Veterinarian to obtain the required documents and/or vaccinations, and/or will be placed in quarantined stabling until the proper documents are obtained. Any horse showing signs of fever/illness/stress is subject to examination by NEE Officials and/or the Show Veterinarian, who may at their sole discretion, place the horse in quarantined stabling or take further action if deemed necessary.

These forms are required to bring a horse to the Temecula Valley National Horse Show and must be submitted 24 hours before arrival. These signed forms will be considered truthful and binding. In the event of any of these protocols being disregarded, we will refuse further entries from all related horses and we will inform USEF for further disciplinary action. Noncompliance with these protocols will result in penalties imposed by USEF on trainers and owners as well as competitions that knowingly permit non compliant horses on the showgrounds. UPON ARRIVAL

VS CHECK-IN AND VETERINARY EXAMINATION OF ALL HORSES (REQUIRED):

A Veterinarian or their technician will examine all horses from VS affected States for vesicular lesions at time of entry to venue. No horse will be permitted entry to stabling, schooling, or competition area without veterinary examination. Rejection of any horse or load of horses with suspect lesions.

TEMPERATURE LOG DURING THE SHOW (REQUIRED):

Monitoring of horses from VS Affected States for the duration of the event. Stall temperature logs required to be completed with twice daily temperature recordings.

Trainer will be issued temperature cards upon arrival and are to post them on the stall doors. Trainers are responsible for temperatures being logged by 9:00am each morning.

IMPLEMENTATION OF VECTOR CONTROL MEASURES (REQUIRED):

On the premises including but not limited to encouraging the use of individual vector control of fly sprays, wipes, or protective covering and premises control measures to eliminate fly breeding areas.

RECENTLY IMPORTED HORSES (REQUIRED):

Must have a minimum 10 day temperature log from the date of arrival into the United States, in addition to all of the above required equine health documents, to attend the Temecula Valley National Horse Show.
