



WAIVER AND RELEASE OF LIABILITY, ASSUMPTION OF RISK AND INDEMNITY AGREEMENT

For and in consideration of United States Equestrian Federation, Inc. dba US Equestrian ("USEF") allowing me, the undersigned, to participate in any capacity (including as a rider, driver, handler, vaulter, longeur, lessee, owner, agent, coach, official, trainer or volunteer) in a USEF sanctioned, licensed or approved event or activity, including but not limited to equestrian clinics, practices, shows, competitions and related or incidental activities and ("USEF Event"); I, for myself, and on behalf of my spouse, children, heirs and next of kin,

and any legal and personal representatives, executors, administrators, successors, and assigns, hereby agree to and make the following contractual representations pursuant to this Agreement (the "Agreement"):

A. RULES AND REGULATIONS: I hereby agree that I have read, understand, and agree to be bound by all applicable Federation Bylaws, rules, and policies including the USEF Safe Sport Policy and Minor Athlete Abuse Prevention Policies (MAAPP) as published at www.usef.org, as amended from time to time.

B. ACKNOWLEDGMENT OF RISK: I knowingly, willingly, and voluntarily acknowledge the inherent risks associated with the sport of equestrian and know that horseback riding and related equestrian activities are inherently dangerous, and that participation in any USEF Event involves risks and dangers including, without limitation, the potential for serious bodily injury (including broken bones, head or neck injuries), sickness and disease (including communicable diseases), trauma, pain & suffering, permanent disability, paralysis and death; loss of or damage to personal property (including my mount & equipment) arising out of the unpredictable behavior of horses; exposure to extreme conditions and circumstances; accidents involving other participants, event staff, volunteers or spectators; contact or collision with other participants and horses, natural or manmade objects; adverse weather conditions; facilities issues and premises conditions; failure of protective equipment (including helmets); inadequate safety measures; participants of varying skill levels; situations beyond the immediate control of the USEF Event organizers and competition management; and other undefined, not readily foreseeable and presently unknown risks and dangers ("**Risks**").

EQUINE ACTIVITY LIABILITY ACT WARNING:

CAUTION: HORSEBACK RIDING AND EQUINE ACTIVITIES CAN BE DANGEROUS. RIDE AT YOUR OWN RISK. Under the laws of most States, an equine activity sponsor or equine professional is not liable for any injury to, or the death of, a participant in equine activities resulting from the inherent risks of equine activities.

C. ASSUMPTION OF RISK: I understand that the aforementioned Risks may be caused in whole or in part or result directly or indirectly from the negligence of my own actions or inactions, the actions or inactions of others participating in the USEF Events, or the negligent acts or omissions of the Released Parties defined below, and I hereby voluntarily and knowingly assume all such Risks and responsibility for any damages, liabilities, losses, or expenses that I incur as a result of my participation in any USEF Events. I also agree to be responsible for any injury or damage caused by me, my horse, my employees or contractors under my direction and control at any USEF Event.

D. WAIVER AND RELEASE OF LIABILITY, HOLD HARMLESS AND INDEMNITY: In conjunction with my participation in any USEF Event, I hereby release, waive and covenant not to sue, and further agree to indemnify, defend and hold harmless the following parties: USEF, USEF Recognized Affiliate Associations, the United States Olympic & Paralympic Committee (USOPC), USEF clubs, members, Event participants (including athletes/riders, coaches, trainers, judges/officials, and other personnel), the Event owner, licensee, and competition managers; the promoters, sponsors, or advertisers of any USEF Event; any charity or other beneficiary which may benefit from the USEF Event; the owners, managers, or lessors of any facilities or premises where a USEF Event may be held; and all directors, officers, employees, agents, contractors, and volunteers of any of the aforementioned parties (**Individually and Collectively, the** "**Released Parties**" or "Event Organizers"), with respect to any liability, claim(s), demand(s), cause(s) of action, damage(s), loss, or expense (including court costs and reasonable attorney fees) of any kind or nature ("Liability") which may arise out of, result from, or relate in any way to my participation in the USEF Events, including claims for Liability caused in whole or in part by the negligent acts or omissions of the Released Parties.







An exhibitor may only compete in one age-break section of the Championships in a given year regardless of age eligibility.

QUALIFYING: 21-and-under riders must earn 6 points in CPHA Foundation qualifying classes since the previous fnal to qualify (points awarded 10,6,4,3,2). 14-and-under and 22-and-over need to compete in one qualifying class prior to the Championships, no points are needed to qualify.

FORMAT: Fences to be set at 3'3". Final consists of one warm-up class, two rounds for all competitors, and a work-of of the top four riders and any additional riders within three points of the leader.

SCORING: Two judges will sit together and use the open numerical system for scoring. At the completion of round 2, riders' scores will be averaged to calculate an overall score. All carryover scores from round 1 will be announced when the rider completes round 2. Judges will rank the work-of riders in order of preference and the scores will not be announced. This ranking determines the winner.

WORK-OFF: After the completion of round 2, the riders with the top four scores and any additional riders within three points of the leader will be required to work-of. The tests will be at the discretion of the judges. If there are six or more riders in the work-of, riders should remain outside the ring where they can walk, trot, or canter but may not do any additional schooling of jumps and may not receive any outside assistance.

COURSE: Fences to be set at 3'3". Championships consist of two advanced equitation courses with a minimum of two USEF Tests (choosing from 2,8,10,12,16,17,18,20), which are included in each course. For riders 21-and-under, a liverpool and a triple combination will be included in the course in at least one round. For riders 22-and-over, riders will not be asked to dismount, mount, or jump without stirrups. The judges and the Technical Delegate will confer with the course designer to approve the USEF Tests prior to the start of the course walk for each round. Judges must walk the course before the exhibitors.

Additional Clarifcations on USEF Tests used in Round 1 and 2:

The CPHA Foundation Championship Counter Lead Standard: The counter canter must be originated through a downward transition, shown at a designated marker, and executed through a complete corner or a change of direction.
Modifes USEF 10: Changes of lead on a line demonstrated by a simple or fying change of lead must allow the rider to decide the type of change to perform.

AWARDS: Ribbons and awards will be given in the frst and second rounds to tenth place. Top ten overall awards will be presented after work-of. Special awards will be given to the top three overall fnishers.

Ties in round 1 and 2 will be broken by the call judge, who will be determined prior to the start of the class. In the event of an overall tie for riders not included in the work-of, the rider with the highest score in round 2 will receive the higher overall placing.

EQUIPMENT: Tack allowed per USEF EQ106.5a.1.2.3.

HORSE RESTRICTIONS: The same horse may not be ridden in diferent age groups. A rider must show the same horse through all phases of the competition. In the event of illness or injury of the horse, the rider may petition the Technical Delegate to ride a substitute horse. The substitution must be approved by an appeals committee consisting of the Technical Delegate, Show Steward, and the official show veterinarian (who has examined the horse and determined its unsuitability to continue).

PROTESTS: If a competitor or trainer wishes to discuss any part of the CPHA Foundation Championships with a judge or the course designer, the Technical Delegate or a Show Steward must also be present.

A protest must be made in writing within 30 minutes of the completion of the class to the Technical Delegate or a Show Steward. A committee consisting of the Technical Delegate, the Show Steward, and a representative of show management will be convened as soon as feasible to rule on the protest. This committee will be the sole arbiter of the protest and its decision will be final without further recourse of any kind.

PHASE ONE - DAY ONE (TUESDAY, JUNE 24 AT 10:30AM)

Over fences format using open numerical scoring system; two judges delivering one score; course to consist of Equitation Type Course using fences and track similar to a National Final with fences set at 3'3. Judges are paired with a scribe who keeps track of Judges' comments on a comment card which is to be given to competitor upon completion of Phase One. Order of go - random draw.

PHASE TWO - DAY ONE (TUESDAY, JUNE 24 AT 5:30PM)

Mandatory participation by riders and trainers for an evening social & video presentation featuring: "Equitation – an American Tradition of Excellence" followed by a Q&A between the judges, trainers, and riders.

PHASE THREE - DAY TWO (WEDNESDAY, JUNE 25)

All riders from Phase One are invited to compete in Phase Three (second over fences round) – upon reverse order of score. Over fences format using open numerical scoring system; two Judges delivering one score. Course to consist of Equitation Type Course using fences and track similar to a National Final with fences set at 3'3.

Judges are paired with a scribe who keeps track of Judges' comments on a comment card which will be given to competitor upon completion of the Final Phase. Phase One and Phase Three (second over fences round) Scores added together for final score; Additional Testing of the Top 6; Work-off scored using a numerical scoring system, however not to be announced – only noted along with Judges' comments on comment card.

I. <u>Membership and Participation Requirements</u>

- A. Riders, Owners and Trainers must be current Active members of USEF and USHJA before the start of the championship. (see GR202)
- B. Horses must be recorded with the Federation and registered with USHJA to participate in the championship.
- C. **Exception:** Foreign residents and horses and ponies in good standing with their National Federation are eligible to compete in this class but will not receive points unless they follow I.A. and I.B.
- D. The same horse may not compete in the USHJA National Hunter Derby Regional Championship and the International Hunter Derby at the same competition.
- E. Horses entered in this class are not required to show in any other classes at the horse show.
- F. Riders are limited to competing no more than four (4) horses in the championship, however, a competition may choose to further limit the number of horses a rider can compete to three (3) horses, as long as the competition notifies the USHJA sixty (60) days in advance of the date of the class and such limitation is printed in the prize list.
- G. In accordance with HU174.14 the same horse-and-rider combination must compete in both rounds of the National Hunter Derby Championship.
- H. Horses may not be cross entered in multiple sections of the National Hunter Derby Regional Championship.
- I. Attire: Refer to HU107 in the USEF Rule Book for current specifications.
- J. <u>Soundness Horses are required to trot a circle on a loose rein at the end of the Classic Round.</u> <u>Horses may be asked to return to the ring and trot another circle at the judge's discretion. Judges</u> <u>have the authority to disqualify a horse if deemed unsound. If a section is held over two days, horses</u> <u>are required to trot a circle on a loose rein at the end of both Classic and Handy Rounds. The hand</u> <u>jog is not required. Any unsoundness during the competition will be reflected in the scores from the</u> <u>judges (GR1033.6)</u>

II. Judging System

- A. Each section may have the option of having either one (1) or two (2) panels of judges. Each panel will consist of two (2) judges sitting together. One (1) judge on each panel must be a <u>USEF</u> "R" judge, the other judge on each panel may be either a <u>USEF</u> "R" or "r" judge. Each panel will provide one (1) score for each round. See "E" for calculating the Overall Score.
 - 1. All judges must be Federation licensed and in good standing with the Federation and USHJA.
 - 2. No guest cards will be granted for this competition.
 - 3. The judges will be hired by the host competition manager.
- B. No panel may award the same base score to any two (2) competitors in any one (1) round.
- C. The first round shall be judged on performance, hunter pace, jumping style, quality and substance, and movement. After the judges base score is given, one (1) point will be added for each high option fence jumped. The Option Bonus Score of one additional point must be awarded even if there is a refusal, rail down or loss of good jumping style at that higher height option fence, providing that the horse-and-rider combination does jump the higher height option fence. (Two points per panel, four point maximum.)
- D. The second round shall be judged on performance, hunter pace, jumping style, quality and substance, movement, handiness, and brilliance of pace. Handiness is defined as ground saving movement without adversely affecting performance or style. Brilliance of pace is defined as a faster pace than ordinary, without sacrificing performance or style. Handiness is taken into account in the judges' base score. After the judges' base score is given, one (1) point will be added for each high option fence jumped. The Option Bonus Score of one (1) additional point must be awarded even if there is a refusal, rail down or loss of good jumping style at that higher height option fence, providing that the horse-and-rider combination does jump the higher height option fence. (Two points per panel, four point maximum.)

E. Overall Score - The final score from each round (3'0" with 3'5" options) will combined to obtain the overall total for each horse

III. Tie Breaking Procedures

- F. No panel may award the same base score to any two competitors in any one round unless a competitor's score is below the cut-off score.
- G. Any ties in all rounds will be broken by the base score (before adding height bonus points) of that round.
- H. All ties for overall first place in the class will compete in a jump-off round. In the case of unsafe conditions preventing a jump-off from being held, the tie will be broken using the second round base score (before adding height bonus points).
- I. Ties for other than first place in the overall standings will be broken using the second round base score (before adding height bonus points).
- J. Prior to the start of the class, if two (2) judging panels are used, one(1) panel must be designated as the tie breaking panel for the first round and another panel must be designated as the tie breaking panel for the second round. The tie breaking panel for the first round will also be designated as the tie breaking panel for the jump-off round.

III. <u>Schooling</u>

A. During the two (2) rounds of the National Hunter Derby, all horses entered must be ridden in official horse show schooling areas unless Management designates a specific schooling area for National Hunter Derby horses. Riders must wear their horse's Derby competition number while mounted. Additionally, competition numbers should be designated a specific color or visible colored dots on standard show numbers, to better assist stewards in distinguishing National Hunter Derby Championship competitors. This includes horses entered simultaneously in another class, if any. Entered horses ridden or schooled elsewhere on the competition grounds or NOT wearing their Derby competition number will be eliminated from competing in the Derby and the entry fee will be forfeited.

IV. Order of Go

- A. The order of go must be posted a minimum of three (3) hours prior to the start of the class. If the Regional Championship class is the first class of the day the order of go must be posted the day before, up to one (1) hour after the show office closes.
- B. In the case of multiple horses being ridden by the same rider, every effort will be made so that there will be a minimum of eight (8) horses (if available) separating multiple rides. All horses must be ridden in the sequence that appears on the jumping order in the first round of the competition. In the second round horses will return in reverse order of their first round scores (lowest to highest). Due to multiple rides or rider conflicts, any rider may elect to move up in the order. Should a jump-off occur, horses will return in the same order in which they competed in the second round.
- C. The draw may be performed by hand or competition management may host a computer draw.

V. <u>Competition Format</u>

- A. The USHJA National Hunter Derby Regional Championship will be composed two (2) rounds: Classic Hunter Style Round and Handy Hunter Round. If required, a Jump-off Round will be held.
 - 1. The National Hunter Derby Championship Classic Hunter Style Round consists of the entered horses present for this event. These horses will compete over a Classic Hunter Course.
 - 2. The National Hunter Derby Championship Handy Hunter Round consists of a minimum of the top twenty (20) horses, including horses tied for 20th, from the Classic Hunter Style

Round. These horses will compete over a Handy Hunter Course.

- 3. Jump-off Rounds, if required, consist of the horses tied for first place. These horses will compete over a Handy Hunter Course. All other ties will be broken according to the tie-breaking procedures.
- B. If needed, Competition Management is permitted to schedule the USHJA National Hunter Derby Regional Championship over two (2) days.

VI. <u>Competition Requirements</u>

- A. The USHJA National Hunter Derby Regional Championship will be offered as three (3) separate sections. One (1) National Hunter Derby Regional Championship section will be an Open class, one (1) National Hunter Derby Regional Championship section will be restricted to Amateurs, and one (1) National Hunter Derby Regional Championship section will be restricted to Juniors.
 - 1. If there are fewer than twelve (12) entries in either section (National Hunter Derby restricted to Amateurs and National Hunter Derby restricted to Juniors), the two (2) sections must be combined. When combined, the total minimum \$7,500 prize money must be divided between the two (2) remaining sections, offering \$3,750 for each section.
 - 2. If there are fewer then twelve (12) entries in either section, once the Amateurs and Juniors have been combined, (National Hunter Derby Open and National Hunter Derby restricted to Juniors and Amateurs), the two (2) sections must be combined. When combined, the total minimum \$7,500 prize money must be offered.
 - 3. Competition management is not permitted to restrict entries in any section.
- B. Competition management will provide colored competition back numbers or visible colored dots on standard show number specific to National Hunter Derby Championship competitors to aid Stewards identifying competitors in the schooling areas.
- C. Competition management will remit complete results including prize money awarded to USHJA and USEF within ten (10) days of the conclusion of the competition.
- D. Competition Management will collect and remit to USHJA the <u>\$35</u> per horse entrant fee.
- E. The National Hunter Derby is a featured class of the horse show, and must be presented as such with regard to arena size and location, jump quality, decorations, footing and ring preparation, lighting, etc. The ring used must have spectator seating, a quality sound system, and a dedicated announcer with no other duties during the Derby.
- F. It is important for Management to make sure that the pointing and scoring system is fully understood by spectators. USHJA requests that announcers announce scores using their own style, but containing the following information in a clear manner:
 - First Round
 "The judges score an 84. An additional four points will be awarded for the four higher option fences that were taken, giving our entry a final score of 88 for this round."
 - 2. Second Round "The judges score an 82 for this round. An additional four points will be awarded for the four higher option fences that were taken, giving our entry a final score of 86 for this round." Handiness is taken into account in the judges' base score. The overall score should be announced clearly following the second round score.
- G. USHJA will supply ribbons and coolers. Competitions are responsible for all other awards. However, the USHJA reserves the right to supplement awards.

VII. <u>Course Requirements</u>

A. The course diagrams for each round must be posted a minimum of three (3) hours before the start of the first round. The course for second round must be posted a minimum of three (3) hours prior. Copies of the courses must also be available for distribution.

- B. Dotted lines are prohibited in both the first and second rounds of any National Hunter Derby Regional Championship.
- C. Jumps in ALL Rounds
 - 1. Obstacles must simulate those reminiscent of the hunt field and the course must offer a variety of classic jumps with different appearances such as: natural post and rail, stone wall, white board fence or gate, coop, aiken, hedge, oxer, brush, logs, natural foliage.
 - 2. Natural obstacles such as banks and ditches are not allowed.
 - 3. A minimum of 2" difference is required for the back element of all oxers.
 - 4. Ground lines are not to exceed 18" in depth from the vertical plane of the jump. For appropriate jumps, no ground line is necessary.
 - 5. The jumpable portion of any fence must be a minimum of eight (8) feet on its front face.
 - 6. The top element of all jumps must be in cups except for walls with movable bricks.
 - 7. Flat cups may only be used for log fences and in accordance with Federation rules.
 - 8. Distances will not be adjusted for ponies.
 - 9. Fence height 3'0"
 - 10. There must be four (4) option fences set at 3'5". If there is a difference in difficulty between any two (2) tracks containing height options, the higher options should include the more inviting, less difficult track.
- D. Classic Hunter Style Course (First Round)
 - 1. A minimum of ten (10) obstacles must be offered in the Classic Hunter Round.
 - 2. At least one (1) in and out.
 - 3. At least one (1) bending line.
 - 4. At least one (1) line with an unrelated distance.
 - 5. At least one (1) long approach.
- E. Handy Hunter Course (Second Round)
 - 1. A minimum of eight (8) obstacles must be offered in the Handy Hunter Round.
 - 2. The course should simulate riding over hunt country and must include a minimum of two (2) handy options, such as: tight turn options, different tracks, clever options for jump approaches, pen type obstacles, hand gallop a jump, trot a lowered obstacle not to exceed 2'0" in height, halt and/or back. Leading over an obstacle and opening and/or closing a gate(s) while mounted or not mounted is not permitted. Gimmicky options are not appropriate.
- F. Jump-Off Round
 - 1. A minimum of eight (8) obstacles must be offered in the jump-off round.
 - 2. The course should simulate riding over hunt country and must include a minimum of two (2) handy options.
 - 3. The Jump-Off round cannot replicate the first or second round courses.

VIII. Awards Presentations

- A. Competition management may offer additional awards for the Overall Champion of each Section:
 - 1. Owner
 - 2. Rider
 - 3. Trainer
- B. The Overall Champion from each section will be presented with a bridle ribbon, cooler and a sponsor award, if available.
- C. Ribbons will be awarded to the top twelve (12) placings for each phase, and top twenty (20) for overall placings.

IX. Prize Money and Entry Fee

A. A minimum of \$7.500 in prize money must be offered per championship, \$2,500 per section. When two (2) sections are combined, a minimum of \$3,750 in prize money must be offered per section.

- B. An additional \$50 'add back' fee will be paid per horse, in addition to the entry fee, to further supplement the prize money in their specific section.
- C. Payouts within each section will follow the model listed below.
- D. The entry fee must not exceed 10% of the prize money offered in the class. (*This does not include the additional prize money generated by the add back fees*)
- E. Prize money must be paid to a minimum of twelve (12) places as follows:

1st - 30%	5th - 6%	9th – 3%
2nd - 22%	6th – 5%	10 th - 2%
3rd - 13%	7th – 4%	11 th - 2%
4th - 8%	8th - 3%	12th - 2%

- F. Competitions wishing to offer additional prize money above the minimum required and pay additional placings must print the information in the prize list and notify the USHJA of the final prize money distribution. If a change in prize money and placings occurs after the prize list is printed, the competition must follow all USEF rules regarding changes to the prize list (See GR904). The prize money awarded to each placing below 12th place must not exceed the amount awarded to 12th place.
- G. If there are fewer than twelve (12) entries in the class, prize money must be paid according to the breakdown in Point Section X.E, through the last placing entry. Any remaining prize money not awarded due to fewer than twelve (12) entries may be split and awarded equally to all entrants that place in the class.
- H. The top twelve (12) overall riders must ride for ribbons in order to receive prize money.

X. National & Zone HOTY Points and Awards

- A. In order for National Hunter Derby <u>National and</u> Zone HOTY points to be awarded, riders must complete a USHJA Exhibitor Declaration Form prior to the conclusion of the competition.
- B. Points accrued by horses shown by Professionals may be awarded to the declared Green Hunter 3'0", Green Hunter 3'3" Performance Hunter 3'3", Small Hunter, 5 year old, 6 year old, 7 year old Young Hunter Sections.
- C. Points accrued by horses shown by Juniors or Amateurs may be awarded to the declared Green Hunter 3'0", Green Hunter 3'3" Performance Hunter 3'3", or the applicable Children's, Pony, Adult Amateur, Amateur Owner 3'3", Small Hunter or Junior Hunter 3', 5 year old, 6 year old, 7 year old Young Hunter Sections.
- D. The money won and points won in the USHJA National Hunter Derby will only be awarded towards a declared Hunter section for HOTY points if a horse competes in the declared section a minimum of one (1) time during the competition year.
- E. For USHJA Awards purposes, a computer ranking system tracks the money won by horse and rider, both nationally and by zone.

XI. Other

- A. The following meetings must be held prior to the start of the class:
 - 1. Officials Meeting must be attended by the Judges, Course Designer, Steward and Competition Manager to review the specifications, judging system and to walk the course. 2.
 - 2. Riders Meeting will be held to answer any questions regarding the course, judging system and class specifications.

2025 USHJA Green Hunter Incentive Regional Championships Specifications

*Effective for competitions starting December 1, 2024 November 30, 2025 Changes from 2024 marked in bold, italic and underlined.

I. Membership and Participation Requirements

- A. Open to horses of any age that are eligible to compete as a Green 3', 3'3", 3'6" or 3'9" Hunter under Federation rules. It is the exhibitor's responsibility to verify the USEF Green eligibility of the horse before competing.
- B. Horses must be enrolled in the USHJA Green Hunter Incentive Program and pay the annual enrollment fee prior to competing in the Regional Championship. Additionally, horses must be registered with USHJA and recorded with USEF to participate. It is the exhibitor's responsibility to enroll their horse in a timely manner in order to be eligible to participate.
- C. Horses may only be enrolled online. If a horse is enrolled during a competition, the horse's enrollment date will be considered the first day of the competition at which it was enrolled.
- D. Enrolled horses are not required to have competed in a Green Hunter section at any USEF Licensed Competition to compete in a Regional Championship. However, competing in a Regional Championship will affect their Green status.
- E. Soundness horses are required to trot a circle on a loose rein at the end of the over fences performance. Horses may be asked to return to the ring and trot another circle at the judge's discretion. *Judges have the authority to disgualify a horse due to unsoundness at any time during the over fences performance.*
- F. Horses may be ridden by a Professional, Junior or Amateur.
- G. Horses may compete in multiple Regional Championships per year.

II. <u>Prize Money and Entry Fee</u>

- A. A minimum of \$10,000 in prize money must be offered for the championship, whether the height sections are separate or combined. USHJA will provide \$5,000 of the prize money.
- B. Rider Ranking System– Show managers may award additional prize money above the required prize money amounts, at their discretion to the highest-placing Tier II <u>and Tier III</u> riders. Refer to the USHJA website for Tier eligibility lists. Tier II<u>and Tier III</u> money must not exceed the money awarded for the rest of the class. Show managers may secure Tier II<u>and Tier III</u> money through a non- allocated additional percentage of entry fees or through sponsorships.
- C. The entry fee must not exceed 10% of the prize money offered in the class.
- D. Prize money must be paid to a minimum of 12 places as follows:

1st-30%	7th-4%
2nd-22%	8th-3%
3rd-13%	9th-3%
4th-8%	10th-2%
5th-6%	11th-2%
6th-5%	12th-2%

E. Competitions wishing to offer additional prize money above the minimum required (*including any add-back money if applicable*) and pay additional placings must print the information in the prize list and notify the USHJA of the final prize money distribution. If a change in prize money and placings occurs after the prize list is printed, the competition must follow all USEF rules regarding changes to the prize list (See GR903). *The prize money awarded to each placing below 12th place must not exceed the amount awarded to 12th place.*

- F. If there are less than 12 entries in the class, prize money must be paid according to the breakdown in Section II.D, through the last placing entry. Any remaining prize money not awarded due to less than 12 entries may be split and awarded equally to all entrants that place in the class.
- G. At minimum, the top six overall must be presented in the ring. All other placing presentations will be at the show management's discretion.

III. HOTY Points

- A. National Horse of the Year points/money are awarded to each horse's respective Green Hunter height section. Horses will be awarded both HOTY points and the value of their money won for their green hunter section, toward the appropriate HOTY and money won standings.
- B. The USHJA Green Hunter Incentive classes will count toward National and Zone HOTY points or money won awards. *Points may not be credited toward the HOTY awards for the Green Conformation Hunter 3'6" or the High Performance Conformation Hunter.
- C. Points for Regional Championships

IV. Judging Format

- A. The Green Hunter Incentive Regional Championship shall be judged on quality, movement, jumping style, manners and way of going, using the open numerical scoring system.
- B. A score will be announced after each round.
- C. The class will be judged by a minimum of two Registered (Large R) USEF Hunter Licensed judges.
- D. Rounds one and two will each account for 50% of the total score. Awards will be distributed based on the cumulative total of both rounds.

V. <u>Course Requirements</u>

A. A minimum of eight obstacles must be offered in the class.

B. Fences must be set at 3', 3'3", 3'6" or 3'9" in height in accordance with how management chooses to offer and conduct the class and courses must be suitable for Green Hunters.

VI. <u>Competition Requirements</u>

- A. One regional championship per region will be established per competition year.
- B. Competition management will collect and remit to USHJA a fee of \$20 per entry at Channel I rated competitions and competitions that have been approved for a Special Competition status.
- C. Competition management must check at <u>www.ushja.org</u> to verify that all entries in the USHJA Green Hunter Incentive Regional Championship have been officially enrolled in the Green Hunter Incentive Program.
- D. Competitions must offer each height section (3', 3'3", 3'6", 3'9"). Competitions may combine height sections.
- E. The two round USHJA Green Hunter Incentive Regional Championship must be held in a featured location. It is to be promoted and conducted by management as one of the featured classes of the competition.
- F. The first round of the USHJA Green Hunter Regional Championship may be run concurrently with another Green Hunter Stake class or championship. The second round must be held separately.
- G. A USHJA Green Hunter Incentive Regional Championship must run if there are a minimum of six (6) entries.
- H. The second round must be run with 12 qualified entries. Exception: if championship entries are fewer than 12, all entries who were not eliminated in the first round must be allowed to enter the second round.
- I. Competition management must report the results of this class separately from the results of the Green Hunter height section classes and send a copy of these results to both the USEF and USHJA within 10 days of the conclusion of the competition.
- J. USHJA will supply a limited amount of ribbons and coolers. Competitions may offer additional awards at their own expense. The USHJA reserves the right to supplement awards.

I. <u>Oualifying Criteria</u>

- A. All ponies that have placed first (1st) through twelfth (12th) overall in at least one (1) USHJA Pony Hunter Derby at a licensed USEF Channel I or Channel II competitions within the qualifying period will be invited to compete in the USHJA Pony Hunter Derby Championship.
- B. The qualifying period begins at the conclusion of each coast's 202<u>4</u> qualifying period and will include competitions with a start date of no less than 60 days prior to the start of the coast's 202<u>5</u> championship. (Exact qualifying dates will be listed on the website here).
- C. If an East Coast and West Coast Championship are offered qualified ponies may only compete in one Championship.
- D. Entries may be limited on a first-come, first-served basis as needed for scheduling constraints.
- E. USHJA at its discretion can open up the qualifying procedures to allow additional entries should insufficient entries be received by the deadline to fill a championship.
 - 1. In the event the qualifying needs to be opened up to increase entries, it should revert to the previous qualifying criteria that requires ponies to have completed one (1) USHJA Pony Hunter Derby.

II. <u>Defining Eligibility</u>

- A. Riders, owners, and trainers must be current Active members of the Federation and USHJA to participate in this class.
- B. Ponies must be registered with USHJA and have an active horse recording with the Federation to participate in this class.
- C. Ponies must have a valid measurement card or form issued by the Federation.
- D. Rider age and pony size: See <u>*HU141*</u> for current Federation policy. Any rider under the age of 18 years may compete on any pony that is eligible for the Green Pony Hunter section.
- E. At the East <u>and West</u> Coast Championship riders may compete on a total of <u>three</u> ponies, no more than one of any one size.
- F. Rider substitutions will not be allowed *after the first round*.

III. <u>Competition Format</u>

A. The USHJA Pony Hunter Derby Championship will be composed two (2) rounds: Classic Hunter Style Round and Handy Hunter Round, show management may split the class by size if entries exceed ninety (90), fence heights will be adjusted by size (small- 2'3", medium- 2'6" and large- 2'9"-3'0"). Height sections will be capped at fifty (50) large, fifty (50) medium, and thirty (30) small. If a height section has less than six (6) ponies, they must combine, combined height sections should be either small/medium or medium/large. If required, a Jump-off Round will be held.

1. The PHD Championship Classic Hunter Style Round consists of the qualified and entered ponies present for this event. These ponies will compete over a Classic Hunter Course. All ponies must trot a circle for soundness after their classic round, prior to leaving the ring.

2. The PHD Championship Handy Hunter Round consists of the top 12 ponies, from the Classic Hunter Style Round. These ponies will compete over a Handy Hunter Course.

3. Jump-off Rounds, if required, consist of the ponies tied for first place. These ponies will compete over a Handy Hunter Course. All other ties will be broken according to the tie-breaking procedures in

Section IX.

4. If needed, Competition Management is permitted to schedule the USHJA Pony Hunter Derby Championship over two (2) days.

IV. Official Jog Format

A. All ponies must complete a trot circle for soundness at the conclusion of their Classic round prior to exiting the ring.

V. <u>Course Requirements</u>

- A. The course diagrams for each round must be posted a minimum of one hour before the start of the first round, unless the second round is held at another time. In that case, the course for second round must be posted a minimum of one hour prior. Copies of the courses must also be available for distribution.
- B. Jumps in ALL Rounds
 - 1. Obstacles must simulate those reminiscent of the hunt field and the course must offer a variety of classic jumps with different appearances such as: natural post and rail, stone wall, white board fence or gate, coop, aiken, hedge, oxer, brush, logs, natural foliage.
 - 2. Natural obstacles such as banks and ditches are not allowed.
 - 3. A minimum of 2" difference is required for the back element of all oxers.
 - 4. Ground lines are not to exceed 16" in depth from the vertical plane of the jump. For appropriate jumps, no ground line is necessary.
 - 5. The jumpable portion of any fence must be a minimum of eight feet on its front face.
 - 6. Flat cups may only be used for log fences and in accordance with Federation rules.
 - 7. Fence heights: Small Pony 2'3"; Medium Pony 2'6"; Large Pony 2'9"- 3'0". One hundred percent of fences must be set at the appropriate height per pony size.
- C. Classic Hunter Style Course (First Round)
 - 1. A minimum of ten obstacles must be offered in the Classic Hunter Round.
 - 2. At least one in and out.
 - 3. At least one bending line.
 - 4. At least one line with an unrelated distance.
 - 5. At least one long approach.
- D. Handy Hunter Course (Second Round)
 - 1. A minimum of eight obstacles must be offered in the Handy Hunter Round.
 - 2. The course should simulate riding over hunt country and must include a minimum of two handy options, such as: tight turn options, different tracks, clever options for jump approaches, pen type obstacles, hand gallop a jump, trot a lowered obstacle not to exceed 2'0" in height, halt and/or back.
 - 3. Leading over an obstacle and opening and/or closing a gate(s) while mounted or not mounted is not permitted. Gimmicky options are not appropriate.
- E. Jump-Off Round
 - 1. A minimum of eight obstacles must be offered in the jump-off round.
 - 2. The course should simulate riding over hunt country and must include a minimum of two handy options.

VI. Order of Go

- A. The Classic Hunter Style Round order of go will be determined using a random draw.
- B. The Handy Hunter Round order of go will be determined by the scores from the Classic Hunter Style Round, with the lowest score returning first and the highest score returning last within each height.
- C. All ponies must be ridden in the sequence that appears on the jumping order for each round of the competition.

VII. <u>Judges</u>

- A. There will be a total of four judges. Judges will be seated separately in two panels consisting of two judges per panel.
- B. One judge on each panel must be an R-licensed hunter judge while the other may be an R-licensed or r-licensed judge.

- C. All judges must be Federation licensed and in good standing with the Federation and USHJA.
- D. No guest cards will be granted for this competition.
- E. The judges will be hired by the host competition manager.

VIII. <u>Judging System</u>

- A. The Classic Hunter Style Round shall be judged and numerically scored on quality, movement, jumping style, manners and way of going. Pace and brilliance are to be rewarded. The two panels' scores will be announced separately and then averaged for a final average numerical score.
- B. The Handy Hunter Round shall be judged and numerically scored on quality, movement, jumping style, manners and way of going. Pace and brilliance are to be rewarded. Handiness is taken into account in the judges' base score. Jumping decorations to utilize a shorter track is NOT permissible. The two panels' scores will be announced separately and then averaged for a final average numerical score.
- C. The final average score of each pony-and-rider combination from the Classic Hunter Style and Handy Hunter Round will be added together to determine their final overall Pony Hunter Derby Championship score. This score will determine the final overall standings for the Pony Hunter Derby Championship.
- D. The Jump-off Round(s), if required, shall be judged and numerically scored on quality, movement, jumping style, manners and way of going. Pace and brilliance are to be rewarded. Jumping decorations to utilize a shorter track is **NOT** permissible. The two panels' scores will be announced separately and then averaged for a final average numerical score.

IX. <u>Tie Breaking Procedures</u>

- A. Prior to the start of the PHD Championship, one judging panel in each round must be designated as the tie breaking panel. In addition, one of these panels will be designated as the overall tie breaking panel.
- B. To determine awards and order of go, if applicable, all ties in the Classic Hunter Style Round and Handy Hunter Round will be broken by the designated tie breaking judging panel score for each round.
- C. All ties for Overall Championship Champion (first place) will compete in a Jump-off Round. If a tie occurs after the Jump-off Round, the exhibitors will be named co-winners, will evenly split the prize money, but tied entrants must determine the distribution of awards amongst themselves.
- D. <u>No more than 12 entries will compete in the Handy Hunter Round. The Handy Hunter Round will only consist of the</u> top 12 entries from Classic Hunter Style Round. Any ties will be broken by the score of the designated Classic Hunter Style Round tie breaker judging panel.
- E. All ties for other than first place in the Overall PHD Championship standings will be broken using the score of the designated overall tie breaking judging panel.
- F. No judging panel may award the same score to any two competitors in any one round unless a competitor's score is below the cut-off score for awards.

X. <u>Prize Money and Awards</u>

- A. Recognition will be given to the following for the Overall Champion of the Championship:
 - 1. Owner
 - 2. Rider
 - 3. Trainer
 - 4. Highest overall scoring Large, Medium, and Small pony.
- B. The Overall Champion will be presented with a bridle ribbon, neck sash, pony cooler, keeper trophy and a sponsor award, if available.
- C. The Reserve Overall Champions will be presented with a bridle ribbon, neck sash and, sponsor award if available.
- D. Ribbons will be awarded to the top twelve (12) placings for each phase, and top *twelve (12)* for overall placings.
- E. <u>*T*</u>he top 12 overall places shall be awarded \$5,000 in prize money. In the event that competition management chooses to split the championship by size, it is the sole responsibility to the competition to ensure that each section receives \$5,000 in prize money.
- F. Prize Money will be distributed as follows:

- 2. <u>In order for points earned to be applied toward USHJA standings and awards, a minimum of six (6) entries</u> <u>must compete in the first round, regardless of competition Channel.</u>
- 3. <u>Year-End Points will be awarded for the overall placings of the USHJA Pony Hunter Derby Championships</u> <u>as follows:</u>

 - 2. Course Designer, and management must be available during exhibitor course walk at the ingate to answer any questions regarding course, judging system or class specifications.

If after combining the 1.00/1.05msections there are fewer than three (3) entries then competition management must further combine the 1.00/1.05m sections with the 1.10/1.15m sections, allowing each section to compete at their respective height. 1.10/1.15m Junior and 1.10/1.15m Amateur Jumper sections must combine if there are fewer than three (3) in either section and may combine if there are fewer than six(6)in either section. If after combining the 1.10/1.15m sections there are fewer than three (3) entries then competition management must further combine the 1.10/1.15m sections with the 1.00/1.05m sections, allowing each section to compete at their respective height.

• 1.00/1.05m Junior Jumper section

• 1.10/1.15m Junior Jumper section

AGE GROUP EQUITATION CHILDREN'S/JUNIOR SECTION Refer to GR1132

FENCE HEIGHT:

Equitation 11 & Under: Minimum 2'6", maximum 2'9" – management must state height at which class will be offered. (Management may offer multiple height options if stated in the prize list, but each course must be set at the same height throughout. Combinations not permitted.)
Equitation 12– 14: Minimum 2'9", maximum 3'3" – management must state height at which class will be offered. (Management may offer multiple height options if stated in the prize list, but each course must be set at the same height throughout. Combinations are optional.)
Equitation 15– 17: Minimum 3'0", maximum 3'5" – management must state height at which class will be offered. (Management may offer multiple height options if stated in the prize list, but each course must be set at the same height throughout. Combinations are optional.)

COMBINING/DIVIDING SECTIONS:

Competition management may offer Age Group Equitation classes divided at their discretion. Equitation that is offered by age will be awarded points that will be credited to the age groups defined in GR1131 or the relevant Zone Specifications.

If the Equitation 11 & Under section is combined with the Equitation 12-14 section, the combined section will be run in accordance with the Equitation 12-14 specifications with optional combinations.

RULES & REGULATIONS

ALL EXHIBITORS: Parents or guardians of minor exhibitors (juniors) and all adults shall hold Nilforushan Equisport Events and Equine Network, Rancho Mission Viejo Riding Park, vendors, exhibitors, and employees harmless for injury, illness or death. No entry will be accepted without the signature of parent or guardian on the entry form. The signatures of instructors, agents, or other unrelated persons will not be accepted.

"EVERY CLASS OFFERED HEREIN WHICH IS COVERED BY THE RULES AND SPECIFICATIONS OF THE CURRENT USEF RULEBOOK WILL BE CONDUCTED AND JUDGED IN ACCORDANCE THEREWITH."

CONDITIONS OF COMPETITION

Eventing Competitions at the Modified Level or above, Combined Driving Competitions at the Advanced Level, Dressage Competitions, Endurance Rides and Vaulting Competitions: (See GR828.4 of the Federation rules). Life, senior active and junior active members shall be eligible to participate in all classes at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions at the Modified Level or above and Combined Driving Competitions at the Advanced Level, Dressage, Reining and Vaulting Competitions and Endurance Rides. A non-member may participate as a handler, rider, driver, owner, lessee, or agent, at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions, Dressage Competitions, Reining Competitions and Combined Driving Competitions upon payment of a Show Pass fee. Participants in the following classes are exempted from the Requirements of this rule: 1) leadline; 2) exhibitions; 3) games and races; 4) classes for 4-H members; 5) walk trot (exception: Friesian performance FR231) and academy classes (academy classes are classes limited to horses used regularly in a lesson program); 6) USDF introductory level tests, pas de deux and quadrille classes; 7) NRHA Endorsed Reining Competitions. 8) Opportunity classes, 9) citizens of other nations who have proof, in English, of current membership in good standing of their own National Federation, 10) USEA beginner novice division; and 11) assistant handlers in Dressage Sport Horse Breeding classes.

USEF ENTRY AGREEMENT

By entering a Federation-licensed Competition and signing this entry blank as the Owner, Lessee, Trainer, Manager, Agent, Coach, Driver, Rider, Handler, Vaulter or Longeur and on behalf of myself and my principals, representatives, employees and agents, I agree that I am subject to the Bylaws and Rules of The United States Equestrian Federation, Inc. (the "Federation") and the local rules of the competition. I agree to be bound by the Bylaws and Rules of the Federation of The United States Equestrian Federation and of the competition. I will accept as final the decision of the Hearing Committee on any guestion arising under the Rules, and agree to release and hold harmless the competition, the Federation, their officials, directors and employees for any action taken under the Rules. I represent that I am eligible to enter and/or participate under the rules, and every horse I am entering is eligible as entered. I also agree that as a condition of and in consideration of acceptance of entry,

the Federation and/or the competition may use or assign photographs, videos, audios, cablecasts, broadcasts, internet, film, news media or other likenesses of me and my horse taken during the course of the competition for the promotion, coverage or benefit of the competition, sport, or the Federation. Those likenesses shall not be used to advertise a product and they may not be used in such a way as to jeopardize amateur status. I hereby expressly and irrevocably waive and release any rights in connection with such use, including any claim to compensation, invasion of privacy, right of publicity, or to misappropriation. The construction and application of Federation rules are governed by the laws of the State of New York, and any action instituted against the Federation must be filed in New York State. See GR 908.4.

The Horse Show Committee reserves the right to itself to interpret all questions and conditions in regard to or arising out of, or incident to the show without claims for damages or recourse of any kind. All questions not covered in these Rules and Regulations shall be decided by the Horse Show Management; its decision to be final. The Horse Show Management reserves to itself the right to limit entries in any class, section or division, to refuse, accept conditionally, or to cancel any entries, disgualify any riders or exhibitors, prohibit exhibition of entries, and cancel award prizes, without any claim for damages; to change any course, to add a dotted line, to cancel or combine any unfilled classes, or to reschedule classes, after due notice to exhibitors; to change rings or rotate judges; to change specifications in jumper classes as competition warrants.

Every horse entered herein for competition will be under the control of the Horse Show Management, but the Show Management will in no case be responsible for any loss or damage that may occur, and it shall be a condition of entry that each exhibitor shall hold the horse show and the officials, employees, directors, officers, sponsoring entities of the horse show and the facilities at which the horse show is held blameless for any loss or accident to his horse(s), employee(s), or equipment which may occur from sickness, fire or other cause.

ENTRY CLOSING DATE: Must be RECEIVED by date indicated on entry blank. A 3% charge will be added to all fees paid by credit card. Closing Dates: 5/19 for Summer Tour 1, 2 & 3 6/23 for Oaks National & International

ENTRY PROCEDURE

- Fees must be paid using a credit card. No cash or checks will be accepted.
- Visa, Master Card, & American Express are accepted.
- Horse Deposit Fee and all other applicable fees on the Entry Form must be submitted with the Entry Form or the Entry will be considered Late. Any partial payment will be applied to later week entries.
- Horse Deposit Fee will be credited to the horse's entries only if the Entry is received by the Closing Date and meets the Entry Procedure.
- Entries received after the Closing Date will be late and subject to the Post Entry Penalty.
- Accounts must be closed at the end of each show week. Management will close Exhibitor Accounts that have not been settled at the conclusion of each show.
- Billing questions or refunds will not be considered after two weeks following the conclusion of the show.
- Exhibitors must close out their account online through ShowGroundsLive. Exhibitors who do not close out by the Monday following each show automatically authorize NEE to close their account using the Credit Card on file. Billing questions or refunds will not be considered. Should you have any questions or concerns with your bill, please call the horse show office directly.
- The Horse Show policies herein stated regarding scratches and refunds will be followed regardless of weather and in place of GR 912.
- Receipt of any entry form to NEE, whether bearing signature or not, will constitute an entry and will be subject to the Rules and Regulations of this prize list.
- Accounts that are not closed out by Monday following each show week by 5:00pm will incur a \$75 late close-out fee.
- RETURNED CHECKS/CHARGEBACKS: Checks returned by the bank or Credit card chargebacks for any reason are regarded as a most serious offense and will be handled according to the following procedure: A \$75 penalty will be assessed for each returned check or chargeback OR 10% of the face value of the check or chargeback, whichever is greater. Accounts will be given ten (10) days to be paid in full with cash or cash equivalent or they will be reported to the U.S. Equestrian Federation, Inc., PCHA and other appropriate association(s) for further disciplinary action. Checks will not be deposited a second time. In the case that the debt is not cleared within 30 days of the conclusion of the show, all prize money will be forfeited.

TRAINER'S BARN ACCOUNT

- Trainer Splits must be done by 12:00pm on Friday.

ENTRY CLARIFICATION

- Classes may only be entered or declared by using a Class Number. A Class Number written on the Entry Form, Add/Scratch Form, or Barn Add/Scratch Form constitutes a Class Entry or Class Declaration.
- An entry with incomplete information for horse, owner, rider or trainer such as a horse entered as "Entry" or "TBA" or any such derivative, will be subject to the \$75 Incomplete Entry Fee. An entry with missing USEF/ USHJA numbers or signatures is also subject to this fee.
- Equitation riders must ride the horse and wear the number of the horse they have entered to ride. There is no penalty for the rider to scratch an equitation class from one horse and add it on another horse. Exhibitors who enter an equitation class on one horse and ride or wear another horse's number will be charged on both horses.
- Any exhibitor who does not compete in a class in which he/she is officially entered, and does not scratch according to the Scratch Procedures outlined below, will be billed for the class.
- Horses shown in a class without being officially entered will be assessed a penalty as shown below
- Exhibitors are responsible for a knowledge of the Rules and Regulations governing the horse show and for their own errors and omissions. In the case of a violation of a cross entry restriction, the exhibitor will forfeit the entry fee, class placing and prize money awards.

- Offical Measurements are available at the show, to be held every Friday at 3:00pm. Please sign up in the show office.
- USEF Horse Recording: Horses must be Recorded with USEF Annually or for Life in order to be eligible for HOTY Awards and/or Zone Awards.
- USHJA Horse Registrations: All horses competing in USEF licensed Hunter/Jumper/Eq competitions must have or obtain a Registration Number from USHJA. PRESENTATION OF CREDENTIALS: THE SHOW SECRETARY WILL NOT ISSUE A NUMBER TO ANY EXHIBITOR UNTIL ASSOCIATION REQUIREMENTS HAVE BEEN MET. ONCE THE NUMBER IS ISSUED, ASSOCIATION FEES, INCLUDING SHOW PASS, WILL NOT BE ADJUSTED FOR THAT SHOW. Failure to provide proper credentials will result in show pass fees and/or Incomplete Entry fees charged in each incident. NOTE: The Exhibitor has the ultimate responsibility for proper registration of horse, owner, rider and trainer with USEF / USHJA and for entering the horse under proper ownership where points are concerned.
- Membership: Present to the Show Secretary proof of current membership, join at the show, or pay Show Pass fees.
- Horse Recording: Present to the Show Secretary proof of USHJA or apply at the Show. Horses must be Recorded with USEF Annually or for Life in order to be eligible for HOTY Awards and/or Zone Awards and to compete in a Grand Prix.
- Horse/Pony Measurement Card: Present to the Show Secretary proof of Measurement or have horse/pony measured at the Show.

CREDIT CARDS

- A declined credit card will be resubmitted and charged a \$50 declined credit card fee. Returned checks will be charged a \$50 returned check fee.
- A closed account, stop payment, incorrect or incomplete credit card information or a charge back will be turned over to sanctioning organizations immediately.
- A 3% Retail Adjustment will be applied to all Credit Card transactions.

HEALTH & VETERINARY

- Sharps & Medical Waste must be placed in the proper receptacles. Anyone found in violation shall be subject to a fine or other penalties deemed necessary by Show Management.
- Show Veterinarian is in residence on the show grounds. The Vet's phone number will be posted at the Show Office.
- Equine Health Requirements will be enforced. All horses (competing or not) that enter the grounds are required to present the Required Health Entry Requirements, including the Event Participation Declaration and Proof of Vaccination All horses are be subject to examination by NEE officials/designated representatives and/or state officials (collectively "officials") for determining whether such animals are, have been infected/exposed, or are likely to become infected with an infectious or contagious disease. If after such examination, officials have reason to believe that an animal's health condition places other animals at risk, such officials, at their sole discretion, may quarantine such animal (and others that may have been infected/exposed) or, if appropriate, require that such animals be transported off the grounds. All participants agree to fully cooperate with event of cials and abide by their decisions and instructions. Failure to comply shall be grounds for immediate expulsion and potential disciplinary action by organization, state/local or federal animal health of cials. All exhibitors are encouraged to review the equine health entry/transport requirements of the destination state prior to entry. Additional information can be obtained from the State Vet Office.

SAFETY

Accidents Involving Competitors. GR1317. In the event of a head injury due to a fall/accident at a licensed competition, the competitor may be prohibited from further competition until released by medical personnel. In some cases, the competitor may not return to competition without a signed release from a licensed medical professional. The competitor may be placed on suspension by USEF until this criteria is met. Competitors are advised to familiarize themselves with this new rule.

- Protective Headgear: It is compulsory for all persons at Federation licensed hunter, jumper or hunter/ jumper competitions in all Hunter, Jumper and Hunt Seat Equitation classes, when mounted anywhere on the competition grounds, to wear properly fastened protective headgear which meets or exceeds ASTM (American Society for Testing and Materials)/SEI (Safety Equipment Institute) standards for equestrian use and carries the SEI tag. It must be properly fitted with harness secured. It is the responsibility of the rider, or the parent or guardian or trainer of the junior exhibitor to see to it that the headgear worn complies with appropriate safety standards for protective headgear intended for equestrian use, and is properly tted and in good condition, and the Federation, Show Committee and Licensed Offcial are not responsible for checking headgear worn for such compliance. GR 801.2,7.
 - Minors who do not have a valid driver's license which allows them to operate a motorized vehicle in the state in which they reside will not be permitted to operate a motorized vehicle of any kind, including, but not limited to, golf carts, motorcycles, scooters, or farm utility vehicles, on the competition grounds of licensed competitions. Minors who have a valid temporary license may operate the above described motorized vehicles as long as they are accompanied by an adult with a valid driver's license. The parent/ legal guardian or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating a motorized vehicle in violation of this rule are solely responsible for any damages, claims, losses or actions resulting from that operation. Violations of this rule will be cause for penalties against those responsible for the child committing the offense. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule. The unsafe use of personal electronic transport devices, as determined by the competition officials and management in their sole discretion, that do not require a driver's license to operate, including but not limited to segways, hover boards, and single wheeled scooters is prohibited on competition grounds. Operating such devices in areas where people gather may be deemed "unsafe use" if there is a risk of harm to others. If the operator of the device is a minor, the parent/legal guardian or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating the device in violation of this rule is accountable and may be subject to penalties.

Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.

- Dogs must be restrained on the show grounds: Loose dogs will be picked up and detained and the owner fined \$100. The owner may be barred from showing and expelled from the show grounds for a second offense, or for refusal to pay the fine, and will not be entitled to any refund of entry or stabling fees paid or due. Management reserves the right to call Animal Control to have an animal removed from the premises.
- Electrical/Fire Regulations: Electrical installation and connections must meet all state and county codes. Aisles shall be maintained clear for a minimum of six feet wide by eight feet high. No obstructions or projections shall be allowed in these aisles. No Class I Flammable Liquids such as gasoline are allowed inside the buildings. Cooking is not permitted within any stable area. Anyone found in violation shall be subject to dismissal from further participation in the horse show without recourse. Additional appliances are not permitted within any stable area. Anyone found in violation shall be subject to con scation of the item(s).
- Exterior Tent alterations are strictly forbidden. The removal of stall tent side poles, side ropes and/or stakes/anchors is strictly prohibited. Any exhibitor found in violation will be issued a single warning. If violation continues, Management reserves the right to remove from the show grounds all property belonging to or under the control of said violator. Further, Management reserves the right to bar any exhibitor found to be in violation from any further participation in the horse show without recourse to any refund of entry or stabling fees paid or due.
- Damage: Owners and exhibitors shall be held responsible for damage caused by them, their agents or employees to stalls, buildings and other properties on the show grounds, and shall be billed accordingly.
- Alcoholic Beverages in any form may not be brought onto the show grounds.

From I-5, take exit 82 onto Ortega Highway, CA 74 and head East. Turn right onto Avenida La Pata. The Rancho Mission Vlejo Riding Park will be immediately on your right.

SAFE SPORT

Reminder: All USEF Life and Senior Active members, as well as participants who have regular contact with minor athletes, are required to comply with the U.S. Center for SafeSport training requirement to be eligible to participate in the competition. All participants must adhere to the U.S. Center for SafeSport Code, USEF Safe Sport Policy, and the Minor Athlete Abuse Prevention Policies. CONDITIONS & SPECIFICATIONS

GENERAL

Poling: Poling is prohibited in the State of California.

Entries May Close: Trainers and Exhibitors are advised that Management may elect to exercise its right to close entries for certain classes. Exhibitors are advised to keep this in mind when submitting their original Entry Form.

Show Weeks May Close: Exhibitors are advised that some show weeks may sell out. After the Closing Date of Entries, priority is given to exhibitors who enter two or more show weeks.

Awards: Ribbons will be awarded for 1st-8th placings. International Riders: All classes held will be run under National rules with regard to riders with the exception of the FEI classes, when applicable. If the capacity of International riders exceeds the National riders rule, riders will be accepted on a 1st come, 1st served basis.

HUNTERS

General: All classes in rated hunter divisions will be judged on performance and soundness and when indicated, conformation, suitability or manners.

Jog: The following sections will not jog: Schooling, Low, Young, Adult, Children's, Short Stirrup, Long Stirrup, Cross Rails, and Green Rider. In divisions where horses are required to jog, horses are expected to circle on a loose rein to prove soundness.

Hunter Champion and Reserve: Awarded to two of the four horses scoring the most points over fences. In addition, only these will receive full points for ribbons won under saddle and half points for ribbons won in the model. In case of a tie, the horse who earned more points over fences wins the championship.

Warm-Up: Complimentary Warm up on on day prior to start of the show from 9 AM - 5 PM in our sand hunter arenas.

Cross Entry Restrictions:

Mod Child/Adult Hunter - no cross entry 3'3 or higher

Green Rider – no cross entry 2'9" or higher (exception: class 776 \$500 Child/Adult Hunter Derby)

Short/Long stirrup - no cross entry 2'3 or higher (exception: Children's Pony Hunter & Rated Pony)

Cross Rail - many not cross enter into any other classes

JUMPERS

Jumper Nomination Fee: \$100

Nominated Jumper Sections: 1.20m – 1.45m, Grand Prix, Jr/Am Jumper 1.20m-1.45m.

Non-Nominated Jumper Sections:

.70m-1.15m, Jr/Am Jumper 1m-1.15m.

Jumper Champion and Reserve: Classics will not count towards Champion and Reserve Champion. However, in case of a tie, the placing in the corresponding Classic will break all ties. For nominated jumpers, money won will determine Champion and Reserve.

Eligibility: Any horse, regardless of winnings, is eligible to enter any .70m-1.45m and Open Jumper class.

Declarations: Nominated Jumpers must declare on the appropriate form in the Show Office by 4 pm the day before the class is to be held. Late declarations will be subject to the Post Entry Penalty and may require the horse to work first or last in the order of go at management's discretion. Classes may be scratched the day of prior to the class starting with no penalty – exception: Special Classes. Classes entered on the Entry Blank constitute a Declaration.

Jumper Tables: Refer to the Time Schedule.

Time Allowed: The Time Allowed will be based on a speed of 382 yards per minute for all sections unless otherwise noted, and may be adjusted accordingly.

Martingales: 1.30m or below: No martingale restrictions when used in a conventional manner. Draw Rein/German Martingales: allowed when schooling or in classes 1.20m or below that do not offer prize money. Above 1.30m (and all classes restricted to young horses): Only running martingales used in the conventional manner. Note: Ponies may not be ridden by a Junior in draw reins or German martingales at any time.

Ties: Ties involving first place will be jumped off. Ties not involving first place will be decided upon time unless otherwise stated.

24 Hour Rule: Horses must be stabled on the grounds 24 hours prior to any class with prize money of \$25,000 or more. 2024 Zone 10 Specifications: (Check USHJA.org for the most updated specs.)

SPECIAL CLASSES

The General Rules and Regulations of the Horse Show will prevail for the Special Classes except as provided for each individual class and as noted herein.

National Standard Grand Prix -

- 1.45m 1.50m with spreads to 1.70m, excluding Triple Bar and the first fence on course. At least 4 Verticals and 2 Oxers must be set at 1.50m. The maximum spread for the Triple Bar is 2.00m.
- Specs: Table II.2.a. National Standard.
- Horse Limit: Riders are not limited to the number of horses they may ride.

Special Hunter Classics: Judged on performance and soundness with manners and suitability emphasized. To be scored under the open numerical judging system. The top 12 (or 1/3) horses (ponies) from the first round will return to jump a second round in reverse order of their scores in the first round; lowest score going first and highest score going last. In case of ties, order of those tied will be drawn. Scores will be averaged from both rounds to determine the winners. In case of a tie for first place only, judges will confer to break the tie. All other ties will remain and riders will toss a coin for the ribbons.

- Separate Two Round Classic For the first round, each competitor will jump one round of approximately 10-12 fences at the required height.
- Designated First Round Classic A designated class of the Division will be the first round of the Classic. You must enter the Classic prior to the start of the first round class. Scratches are not permitted after the First round class has begun. See Time Schedule for Designated First round class.

Special Class Nomination/Declaration: Special Classes added on the day of or after the Order of Go has been drawn will be required to work first in the order.

Special Class Scratch: Any scratch must be made before the class starts. See Rules & Regulations for more information.

• Classics / Grand Prix: In the event of scratch on the day of the class, horses are subject to the Classic / Grand Prix Scratch Fee.

Order of Go: The Order of Go will be drawn. In the jumpoff, if any, all horses will go in the original drawn order

Attire: Formal attire required in Special Classes.

Awards: Winners to ride for presentation of awards in Special Classes.

Trophy & Ribbons: Ribbons will be awarded for 1st-10th placings.

Show Champion or Circuit Champion: Classics will not count toward Show or Circuit Champion
