Thank you for being here for our inaugural season and for supporting us in this new endeavor. We hope you enjoy all that we have to offer, and we look forward to seeing you soon.

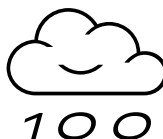

WAIVER AND RELEASE OF LIABILITY, ASSUMPTION OF RISK AND INDEMNITY AGREEMENT

For and in consideration of United States Equestrian Federation, Inc. dba US Equestrian ("USEF") allowing me, the undersigned, to participate in any capacity (including as a rider, driver, handler, vaulter, longeur, lessee, owner, agent, coach, official, trainer or volunteer) in a USEF sanctioned, licensed or approved event or activity, including but not limited to equestrian clinics, practices, shows, competitions and related or incidental activities and ("USEF Event" or "USEF Events"); I, for myself, and on behalf of my spouse, children, heirs and next of kin, and any legal and personal representatives, executors, administrators, successors,, and assigns, hereby agree to and make the following contractual representations pursuant to this Agreement (the "Agreement"):

A. RULES AND REGULATIONS: I hereby agree that I have read, understand, and agree to be bound by all applicable Federation Bylaws, rules, and policies including the USEF Safe Sport Policy and Minor Athlete Abuse Prevention Policies (MAAPP) as published at www.usef.org, as amended from time to time.

B. ACKNOWLEDGMENT OF RISK: I knowingly, willingly, and voluntarily acknowledge the inherent risks associated with the sport of equestrian and know that horseback riding and related equestrian activities are inherently dangerous, and that participation in any USEF Event involves risks and dangers including, without limitation, the potential for serious bodily injury (including broken bones, head or neck injuries), sickness and disease (including communicable diseases), trauma, pain & suffering, permanent disability, paralysis and death; loss of or damage to personal property (including my mount & equipment) arising out of the unpredictable behavior of horses; exposure to extreme conditions and circumstances; accidents involving other participants, event staff, volunteers or spectators; contact or collision with other participants and horses, natural or manmade objects; adverse weather conditions; facilities issues and premises conditions; failure of protective equipment (including helmets); inadequate safety measures; participants of varying skill levels; situations beyond the immediate control of the USEF Event organizers and competition management; and other undefined, not readily foreseeable and presently unknown risks and dangers ("Risks").

EQUINE ACTIVITY LIABILITY ACT WARNING:

CAUTION: HORSEBACK RIDING AND EQUINE ACTIVITIES CAN BE DANGEROUS. RIDE AT YOUR OWN RISK.

Under the laws of most States, an equine activity sponsor or equine professional is not liable for any injury to, or the death of, a participant in equine activities resulting from the inherent risks of equine activities.

C. ASSUMPTION OF RISK: I understand that the aforementioned Risks may be caused in whole or in part or result directly or indirectly from the negligence of my own actions or inactions, the actions or inactions of others participating in the USEF Events, or the negligent acts or omissions of the Released Parties defined below, and I hereby voluntarily and knowingly assume all such Risks and responsibility for any damages, liabilities, losses, or expenses that I incur as a result of my participation in any USEF Events. I also agree to be responsible for any injury or damage caused by me, my horse, my employees or contractors under my direction and control at any USEF Event.

D. WAIVER AND RELEASE OF LIABILITY, HOLD HARMLESS AND INDEMNITY: In conjunction with my participation in any USEF Event, I hereby release, waive and covenant not to sue, and further agree to indemnify, defend and hold harmless the following parties: USEF, USEF Recognized Affiliate Associations, the United States Olympic & Paralympic Committee (USOPC), USEF clubs, members, Event participants (including athletes/riders, coaches, trainers, judges/officials, and other personnel), the Event owner, licensee, and competition managers; the promoters, sponsors, or advertisers of any USEF Event; any charity or other beneficiary which may benefit from the USEF Event; the owners, managers, or lessors of any facilities or premises where a USEF Event may be held; and all directors, officers, employees, agents, contractors, and volunteers of any of the aforementioned parties (**Individually and Collectively, the "Released Parties" or "Event Organizers"**), with respect to any liability, claim(s), demand(s), cause(s) of action, damage(s), loss, or expense (including court costs and reasonable attorney fees) of any kind or nature ("**Liability**") which may arise out of, result from, or relate in any way to my participation in the USEF Events, including claims for Liability caused in whole or in part by the negligent acts or omissions of the Released Parties.

E. COMPLETE AGREEMENT AND SEVERABILITY CLAUSE: This Agreement represents the complete understanding between the parties regarding these issues and no oral representations, statements or inducements have been made apart from this Agreement. If any provision of this Agreement is held to be unlawful, void, or for any reason unenforceable, then that provision shall be deemed severable from this Agreement and shall not affect the validity and enforceability of any remaining provisions.

Those likenesses shall not be used to advertise a product and they may not be used in such a way as to jeopardize amateur status. 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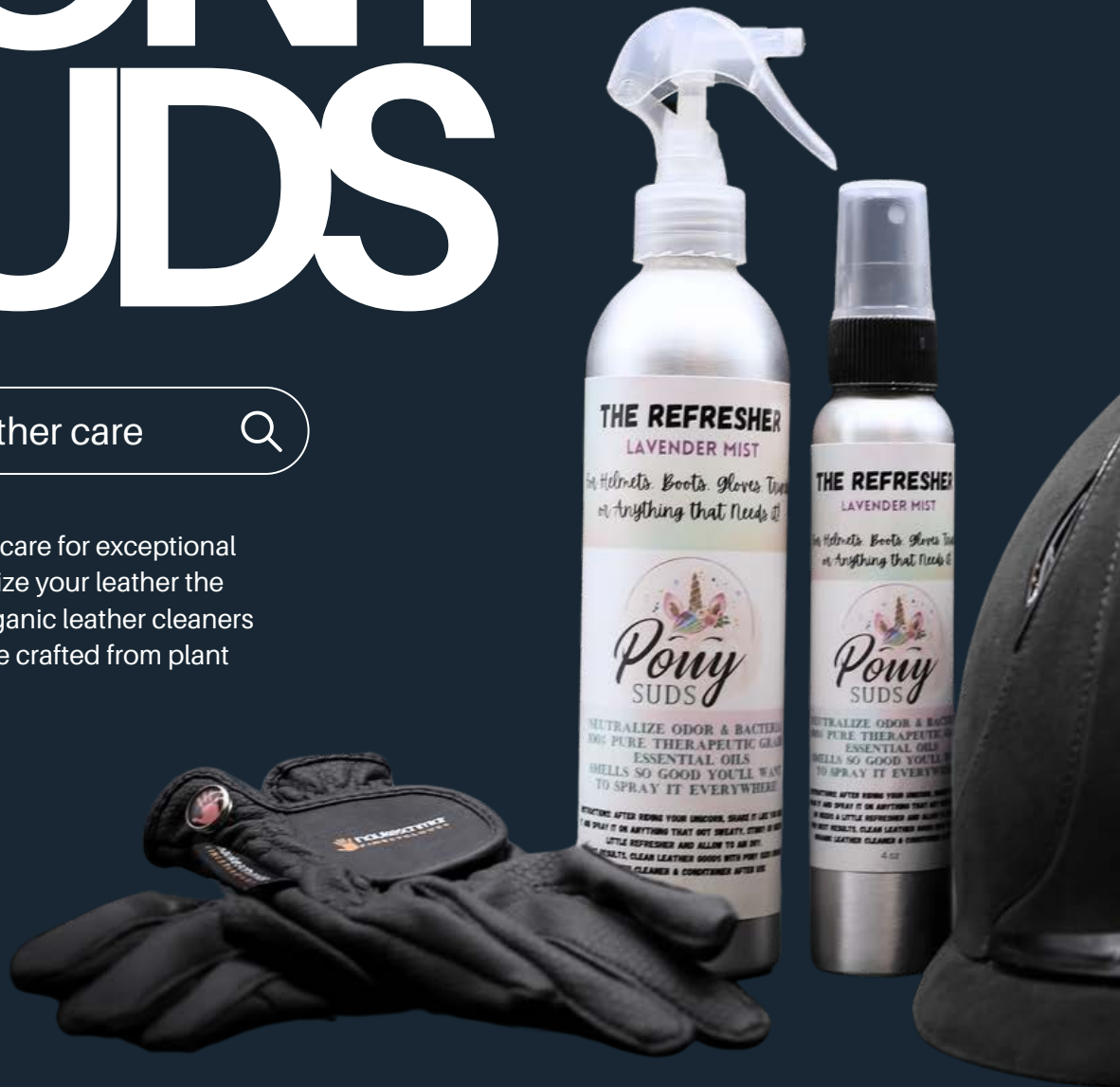

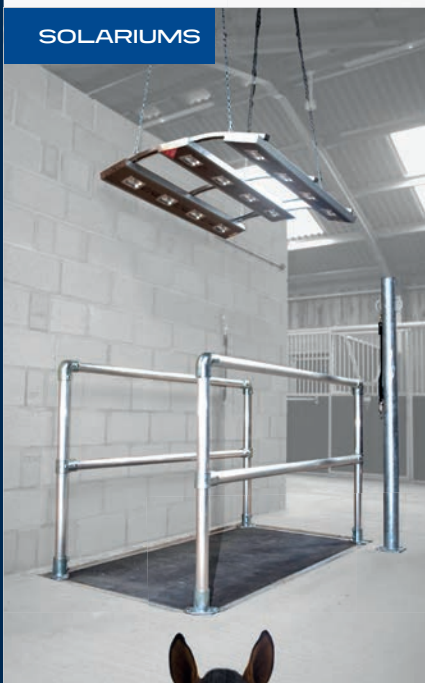

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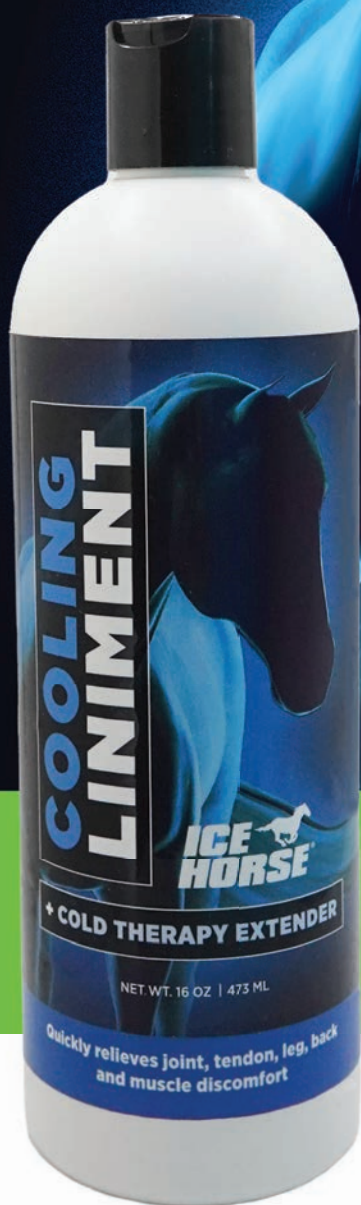

MEDAL FINALS

FOXFIELD MEDAL FINAL

Open to riders that have qualified accumulating at least 10 points in the Foxfield Medal since the 2018 Finals. To be judged on equitation over a course of fences 3'3 in height. The first & second round is a drawn order by qualifiers; all qualifiers will ride both rounds and ribbons 1st-10th will be awarded at the completion of each round. Each round will be scored by two judges that are seated apart and scores will be announced after each round. Scores from both rounds will be averaged for a final score. Any rider(s) having less than 3 percentage points of the top score will be required to work off. If there is a work off, the judges will sit together. The top 10 scores overall will ride for awards & sashes. Trophy, and Cooler for First; Cooler for 2nd; Sashes to 10th. The winner of the Finals is ineligible to participate in any future Foxfield Medal Class.

PCHA JR/AM HORSEMANSHIP 2'9 MEDAL FINAL

PCHA will not sanction any show over the same dates within 100 miles of any PCHA sanctioned Medal Finals or Special Classes. If a manager appeals this decision, only with a 2/3 majority vote of the Board of Directors will permission be granted regardless of USEF rating. If PCHA permission is granted, it will be on a year to year basis only. To be judged by at least 2 judges sitting separately, held over 2 rounds with a work-off of the riders achieving the top 4 scores, plus anyone within 1 point of the 4th place score. The judges may sit together for the work-off. USEF tests 1-15 can be used for the work-off. The work off score will be added to the rider's total but will NOT be announced. The order-of-go for Round 1 will be drawn, Ribbons awarded 1st through 10th. Ties will be broken by designated judge All riders will return for round 2. The order of go for Round 2 will be a computer draw. The draw for Round 2 must be conducted within 1 hour of the conclusion of Round 1. Ribbons awarded 1st through 10th for Round 2. The winner of the Finals is no longer eligible to compete in this class. Trophy/Bronze will be sponsored by Raizy Goffman.

ASPCA MACLAY REGIONAL FINAL

-Entries for Regional Maclay Championship classes close, and must be received by, 5:00 p.m. Eastern Time, September 1, at the NHSAA's office. Entries must be on the Official Entry Form, signed, and submitted with the \$150.00 per class Entry Fee made payable to the NHSAA. The NHSAA reserves the right to reject any late or unsigned entries or entries not submitted with all entry fees.

-Entries may not be accepted directly by any Regionals competition.

-Entry and class lists for Regionals shall be provided by the NHSAA to competitions hosting Regionals no later than 48 hours preceding the commencement of the class. Stall reservations and all other entry and class fees, including competition and processing fees for other classes which might be held during the same competition, must be provided directly to the competition hosting the Regionals.

JUDGING

To be judged on seat, hands, guidance, and control of the horse.

FIRST ROUND

To be shown over a special course of jumps set to the above stated specifications and posted one hour before the start of the class. The course for the Finals shall be designed by a USEF Course Designer who must be selected and/or approved by the NHSSA. The Judges for the Finals will have input and give approval on the course design.

ASPCA MACLAY REGIONAL FINAL (CONT.)

FLAT PHASE

A minimum of twenty four (24) riders, if available, are required to show at a walk, trot and canter. At the sole discretion of the judges, additional flat work may be called for, but all groups must be asked to perform the same tests. No more than twenty (20) riders at a time may be asked to work together in a group at the same time. The flat performance of those riders selected to show in the flat phase shall count 50%. Changing of bit/bridle between phases is permissible.

FINAL ROUND

All riders who competed in the Flat Phase will be asked to return for a final round over a second course following the above stated specifications. The Final Round course may include tests.

TESTING

Testing of up to six riders is optional using USEF Tests 1-23.

CONDITIONS GOVERNING FINALS

Finals are open to junior members of USEF who have not reached their 18th birthday in accordance with GR127, who have been in the top 50 or qualified through one of the Regional competitions. Previous winners of the Finals are ineligible to compete in the Finals.

Only one rider per horse.

Riders that show in the Hamel Foundation National Horse Show 3'3" Equitation Championship are ineligible to compete in the Maclay National Championship Class (ASPCA Maclay Finals) in the same competition year.

Horses that compete in the Hamel Foundation National Horse show 3'3" Equitation Championship or the THIS National Horse Show Adult Equitation Championship are eligible to compete in the Maclay National Championship Class.

Two refusals will eliminate a rider from Finals competition.

Conventional tack per USEF EQ 105.5a. Martingales not permitted for the flat phase. Trainers/Coaches permitted to ride and school competitors' horses. Trainers/Coaches permitted to walk any and all courses with competitors.

In the event a horse becomes incapacitated in any phase of competition, upon examination of the Horse show's veterinarian and a judge or steward, the substitution of a horse that has been previously entered and checked in may be permitted by the NHSAA.

AWARDS

The Judges will select a Champion and a Reserve Champion. Ribbons through twelfth place Trophy to the Trainer of the winning rider.

QUESTIONS AND DISPUTES

Any questions or disputes relating to the Regionals or the Finals, other than that specifically described above, shall be decided according to the rules of the USEF, if applicable, or according to the Prize List if such question is not covered by the rules of the USEF.

HAMEL FOUNDATION NHS 3'3" AREA CHAMPIONSHIP

**** PLEASE NOTE:** Membership in the National Horse Show Association (NHSA) is required for all riders competing in the Hamel Foundation NHS 3'3" Medal Classes/Hamel Foundation NHS 3'3" Area Championship Classes/Hamel Foundation NHS 3'3" Equitation Championship and all trainers who have riders competing in the Hamel Foundation NHS 3'3" Medal Classes/Hamel Foundation NHS 3'3" Area Championship Classes/Hamel Foundation NHS 3'3" Equitation Championship. The membership/ qualifying year is September 1 – August 31. ******

MEMBERSHIP

To compete in the 2025 Hamel Foundation NHS 3'3" Area Championship Classes riders must have been members of the National Horse Show Association ("NHSA") for the current year's qualifying period (September 1, 2024- August 31, 2025).

JUDGING

To be judged on seat, hands, guidance, and control of the horse. After completion of the jumping phase a minimum of twelve (12) riders, if available, are required to show at a walk, trot, and canter. The flat performance of those riders selected to show in the flat phase shall count 50%. Changing of bit/bridle between phases is permissible. Only riders who have completed the course and competed in the flat phase may receive ribbons. Use of the open numerical system of judging not to be used.

- Only one rider per horse.

- Two refusals will eliminate a rider from competition.
- Conventional tack per USEF EQ 105.5a. Martingales not permitted for the flat phase.
- To fill a Hamel Foundation NHS 3'3" Medal Area Championship Class three (3) competitors must complete the course.
- A Hamel Foundation NHS 3'3" Medal Area Championship may not be run using a California split.

Qualifying for Hamel Finals at the Area Championship:

The Champion, Reserve Champion and Third place finisher from each Area Championship, if not otherwise qualified, will receive invitations to compete in the Hamel Foundation NHS 3'3" Equitation Finals provided they have points from competing in Hamel classes in the same competition year.

THIS NHS ADULT AREA CHAMPIONSHIP

**** PLEASE NOTE:** Membership in the National Horse Show Association (NHSA) is required for all riders competing in the Taylor Harris Insurance Services NHS Medal Classes/Taylor Harris Insurance Services NHS Adult Area Championship Classes/Taylor Harris Insurance Services NHS Adult Championship and all trainers who have riders competing in the Taylor Harris Insurance Services NHS Medal Classes/ Taylor Harris Insurance Services NHS Adult Area Championship Classes/ Taylor Harris Insurance Services NHS Adult Championship. The membership/qualifying year is September 1 – August 31. ******

MEMBERSHIP

To compete in the 2025 THIS NHS Adult Championship Classes riders must have been members of the National Horse Show Association ("NHSA") for the current years qualifying period (September 1, 2024-Aug 31, 2025).

JUDGING

To be judged on seat, hands, guidance, and control of the horse. After completion of the jumping phase a minimum of twelve (12) riders, if available, are required to show at a walk, trot, and canter. The flat performance of those riders selected to show in the flat phase shall count 50%. Changing of bit/bridle between phases is permissible. Only riders who have completed the course and competed in the flat phase may receive ribbons. Use of the open numerical system of judging not to be used. USEF Tests 1-23.

THIS NHS ADULT AREA CHAMPIONSHIP (CONT.)

CONDITIONS FOR THIS NHS ADULT MEDAL AREA CHAMPIONSHIP

- Only competitions recognized by the USEF are eligible to hold the THIS NHS Adult Medal Area Championship Classes.
- Only one rider per horse.
- The same horse must be used for all Rounds/Phases of the competition.
- Two refusals will eliminate a rider from competition.
- Conventional tack per USEF EQ 105.5a. Martingales not permitted for the flat phase.
- To fill a THIS NHS Adult Medal Area Championship Class three (3) competitors must complete the course.
- A THIS NHS Adult Medal Area Championship may not be run using a California split.

QUALIFYING FOR THIS FINALS AT THE AREA CHAMPIONSHIP:

The Champion, Reserve Champion and Third place finisher from each THIS Area Championship, if not otherwise qualified, will receive invitations to compete in the Taylor Harris Insurance Services NHS 3'3" Equitation Finals provided they have points from competing in THIS Adult Equitation classes in the same competition year.

USHJA JUNIOR JUMP SEAT MEDAL FINAL

QUALIFICATIONS TO COMPETE

- Riders must be a current active USEF and USHJA Junior member in good standing at the time of the competition.
- A rider is qualified to compete in the USHJA 3'3" Jumping Seat Medal Finals when they have accumulated a minimum of fifteen (15) points in any USHJA 3'3" Jumping Seat Medal classes held from August 2 of the previous competition year through August 1 of the current competition year. The USHJA at its discretion can open up qualifying procedures to allow for additional entries to fill this championship, should insufficient entries be received by the deadline. Additional riders will be invited based on their points earned.
- Any Junior rider that has jumped 1.30m or above or competed in a 3* USEF Show Jumping Talent Search class and/or Final is no longer eligible to compete in a USHJA 3'3" Jumping Seat Medal class or Finals.
- Riders are prohibited from competing in a USEF Show Jumping Talent Search Finals and a USHJA 3'3" Jumping Seat Medal Finals in the same competition year.
- Riders must remain eligible through the completion of the finals.
- Past winners of the USHJA 3'3" Junior Jumping Seat Medal Final are no longer eligible to compete in the class or finals.
- All horses must jog for soundness.

COMPETITION FORMAT

The 3'3" Jumping Seat Medal Finals will be composed of three (3) phases: Phase 1 (Flat Phase), Phase 2 (Gymnastics Phase) and Phase 3 (Jumping Phase).

PHASE 1 (Flat Phase): Flatwork with no more than twelve (12) riders at one time with all groups performing the same test. To be judged on rider's position, seat and the correctness and effectiveness of the aids. Excellence and effectiveness on the flat will be rewarded. The performance begins when the class is called to order. Riders will show in both directions as a group at the working walk, the working trot sitting, and the working trot rising, as well as showing a lengthening of stride; the working canter, and the working canter showing a lengthening of stride. All riders shall be required to show at the working canter on the counter lead in both directions. Judges may require any additional tests on the flat (see EQ113). In addition, basic dressage movements may be tested including but not limited to Shoulder-in, Shoulder-out, Haunches-in, and Haunches-out. The starting order of Phase I shall be assigned by a random draw. All ties will be randomly drawn within that placing to determine the Phase 2 order.

PHASE 2 (Gymnastics Phase):

- Fences shall be set between .85-.95m.
- Phase II exercises may include trot fences, not to exceed .85m. Placing rails, trotting rails and cavalettis are prohibited.
- Rails knocked down will be treated more leniently than in the Phase 3 (Jumping Phase). Phase 2 will have a multiplier of 1.5.
- The start order of Phase II will go in order of scores received in Phase I from lowest to highest.

USHJA JUNIOR JUMP SEAT MEDAL FINAL (CONT.)

PHASE 3 (Jumping Phase): Must be held in a jumper ring utilizing jumper style fences.

- To be shown over a course of ten (10) to twelve (12) numbered obstacles set at a height of 1.0m with spreads up to 1.10m (triple bar up to 1.15m).
- To include: one (1) double combination and one (1) triple combination, or three (3) double combinations.
- The course must also include a dry, above-ground Liverpool.
- Time allowed will be calculated at 350 meters per minute.
- The course will be posted and open thirty (30) minutes prior to the start of the competition.
- Two cumulative refusals will incur elimination.
- Rails down will result in a deduction of four (4) points from the riders' score, time faults in a deduction of one (1) point for each second commenced over the time allowed.
- If as a result of a disobedience a competitor displaces or knocks down any obstacle or in all cases where the nature of the obstacle is changed by knocking down, the tone is sounded and the time is stopped until the obstacle has been rebuilt. When the obstacle has been rebuilt, the tone is sounded to indicate that the course is ready and that the competitor can continue the round. The competitor is penalized for a refusal, the time is restarted at the moment when the horse leaves the ground at the obstacle where the refusal occurred.
- Phase 3 will have a multiplier of two (2). The start order of Phase 3 will be the reverse order of standings after Phases 1 and 2. Ties will be broken by the score from Phase 2.
- A work off is required for all riders within three (3) points of the leader following the completion of Phase 3. The work off will consist of a shortened course with a time allowed calculated at 375m/minute. Scores will not be announced for this phase. Ties will be broken by the score from Phase 3 (Jumping Phase).

RULES & REGULATIONS

ALL EXHIBITORS: Parents or guardians of minor exhibitors (juniors) and all adults shall hold Nilforushan Equisport Events and Equine Network, Rancho Mission Viejo Riding Park, vendors, exhibitors, and employees harmless for injury, illness or death. No entry will be accepted without the signature of parent or guardian on the entry form. The signatures of instructors, agents, or other unrelated persons will not be accepted.

"EVERY CLASS OFFERED HEREIN WHICH IS COVERED BY THE RULES AND SPECIFICATIONS OF THE CURRENT USEF RULEBOOK WILL BE CONDUCTED AND JUDGED IN ACCORDANCE THEREWITH."

CONDITIONS OF COMPETITION

Eventing Competitions at the Modified Level or above, Combined Driving Competitions at the Advanced Level, Dressage Competitions, Endurance Rides and Vaulting Competitions: (See GR828.4 of the Federation rules). Life, senior active and junior active members shall be eligible to participate in all classes at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions at the Modified Level or above and Combined Driving Competitions at the Advanced Level, Dressage, Reining and Vaulting Competitions and Endurance Rides. A non-member may participate as a handler, rider, driver, owner, lessee, or agent, at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions, Dressage Competitions, Reining Competitions and Combined Driving Competitions upon payment of a Show Pass fee. Participants in the following classes are exempted from the Requirements of this rule: 1) leadline; 2) exhibitions; 3) games and races; 4) classes for 4-H members; 5) walk trot (exception: Friesian performance FR231) and academy classes (academy classes are classes limited to horses used regularly in a lesson program); 6) USDF introductory level tests, pas de deux and quadrille classes; 7) NRHA Endorsed Reining Competitions. 8) Opportunity classes, 9) citizens of other nations who have proof, in English, of current membership in good standing of their own National Federation, 10) USEA beginner novice division; and 11) assistant handlers in Dressage Sport Horse Breeding classes.

USEF ENTRY AGREEMENT

By entering a Federation-licensed Competition and signing this entry blank as the Owner, Lessee, Trainer, Manager, Agent, Coach, Driver, Rider, Handler, Vaultor or Longeur and on behalf of myself and my principals, representatives, employees and agents, I agree that I am subject to the Bylaws and Rules of The United States Equestrian Federation, Inc. (the "Federation") and the local rules of the competition. I agree to be bound by the Bylaws and Rules of the Federation of The United States Equestrian Federation and of the competition. I will accept as final the decision of the Hearing Committee on any question arising under the Rules, and agree to release and hold harmless the competition, the Federation, their officials, directors and employees for any action taken under the Rules. I represent that I am eligible to enter and/or participate under the rules, and every horse I am entering is eligible as entered. I also agree that as a condition of and in consideration of acceptance of entry,

the Federation and/or the competition may use or assign photographs, videos, audios, cablecasts, broadcasts, internet, film, news media or other likenesses of me and my horse taken during the course of the competition for the promotion, coverage or benefit of the competition, sport, or the Federation. Those likenesses shall not be used to advertise a product and they may not be used in such a way as to jeopardize amateur status. I hereby expressly and irrevocably waive and release any rights in connection with such use, including any claim to compensation, invasion of privacy, right of publicity, or to misappropriation. The construction and application of Federation rules are governed by the laws of the State of New York, and any action instituted against the Federation must be filed in New York State. See GR 908.4.

The Horse Show Committee reserves the right to itself to interpret all questions and conditions in regard to or arising out of, or incident to the show without claims for damages or recourse of any kind. All questions not covered in these Rules and Regulations shall be decided by the Horse Show Management; its decision to be final. The Horse Show Management reserves to itself the right to limit entries in any class, section or division, to refuse, accept conditionally, or to cancel any entries, disqualify any riders or exhibitors, prohibit exhibition of entries, and cancel award prizes, without any claim for damages; to change any course, to add a dotted line, to cancel or combine any unfilled classes, or to reschedule classes, after due notice to exhibitors; to change rings or rotate judges; to change specifications in jumper classes as competition warrants.

Every horse entered herein for competition will be under the control of the Horse Show Management, but the Show Management will in no case be responsible for any loss or damage that may occur, and it shall be a condition of entry that each exhibitor shall hold the horse show and the officials, employees, directors, officers, sponsoring entities of the horse show and the facilities at which the horse show is held blameless for any loss or accident to his horse(s), employee(s), or equipment which may occur from sickness, fire or other cause.

ENTRY CLOSING DATE: Must be RECEIVED by date indicated on entry blank. A 3% charge will be added to all fees paid by credit card.

ENTRY PROCEDURE

- Fees must be paid using a credit card. No cash or checks will be accepted.
- Visa, Master Card, & American Express are accepted.
- Horse Deposit Fee and all other applicable fees on the Entry Form must be submitted with the Entry Form or the Entry will be considered Late. Any partial payment will be applied to later week entries.
- Horse Deposit Fee will be credited to the horse's entries only if the Entry is received by the Closing Date and meets the Entry Procedure.
- Entries received after the Closing Date will be late and subject to the Post Entry Penalty.
- Accounts must be closed at the end of each show week. Management will close Exhibitor Accounts that have not been settled at the conclusion of each show.
- Billing questions or refunds will not be considered after two weeks following the conclusion of the show.
- Exhibitors must close out their account online through ShowGroundsLive. Exhibitors who do not close out by the Monday following each show automatically authorize NEE to close their account using the Credit Card on file. Billing questions or refunds will not be considered. Should you have any questions or concerns with your bill, please call the horse show office directly.
- The Horse Show policies herein stated regarding scratches and refunds will be followed regardless of weather and in place of GR 912.
- Receipt of any entry form to NEE, whether bearing signature or not, will constitute an entry and will be subject to the Rules and Regulations of this prize list.
- Accounts that are not closed out by Monday following each show week by 5:00pm will incur a \$75 late close-out fee.
- RETURNED CHECKS/CHARGEBACKS: Checks returned by the bank or Credit card chargebacks for any reason are regarded as a most serious offense and will be handled according to the following procedure: A \$75 penalty will be assessed for each returned check or chargeback OR 10% of the face value of the check or chargeback, whichever is greater. Accounts will be given ten (10) days to be paid in full with cash or cash equivalent or they will be reported to the U.S. Equestrian Federation, Inc., PCHA and other appropriate association(s) for further disciplinary action. Checks will not be deposited a second time. In the case that the debt is not cleared within 30 days of the conclusion of the show, all prize money will be forfeited.

TRAINER'S BARN ACCOUNT

- Accounts that are not closed out by Monday following each show week by 5:00pm will incur a \$75 late close out fee.
- Trainer Splits must be done by 12:00pm on Friday.

ENTRY CLARIFICATION

- Classes may only be entered or declared by using a Class Number. A Class Number written on the Entry Form, Add/Scratch Form, or Barn Add/Scratch Form constitutes a Class Entry or Class Declaration.
- An entry with incomplete information for horse, owner, rider or trainer such as a horse entered as "Entry" or "TBA" or any such derivative, will be subject to the \$75 Incomplete Entry Fee. An entry with missing USEF/USHJA numbers or signatures is also subject to this fee.
- Equitation riders must ride the horse and wear the number of the horse they have entered to ride. There is no penalty for the rider to scratch an equitation class from one horse and add it on another horse. Exhibitors who enter an equitation class on one horse and ride or wear another horse's number will be charged on both horses.
- Any exhibitor who does not compete in a class in which he/she is officially entered, and does not scratch according to the Scratch Procedures outlined below, will be billed for the class.
- Horses shown in a class without being officially entered will be assessed a penalty as shown below
- Exhibitors are responsible for a knowledge of the Rules and Regulations governing the horse show and for their own errors and omissions. In the case of a violation of a cross entry restriction, the exhibitor will forfeit the entry fee, class placing and prize money awards.
- Show means the Show Week.

ADD/SCRATCH/CHANGE: Any complete Show Scratch must be made in writing in the Show Office on an official form, by letter, or via email, and received prior to the start of the applicable class or show. Scratching a class "at the gate" does not constitute an official scratch. Once a class or division begins, it may not be scratched, except for a Vet Scratch. If a Vet Scratch, the horse must be scratched in the Show Office on the day of the class and the Official Show Vet's Certificate must be received that day. Scratch Fee will still apply. A class that has been closed may not be scratched.

- Feed Store: Hay, grain and bedding may be purchased on the grounds. For deliveries prior to or upon arrival, order on ShowGroundsLive.com. Place orders by noon for same-day delivery. Questions with regard to feed and bedding charges will not be considered after noon on Friday. Discrepancies in deliveries will not be considered unless brought to the attention of the Feed Office within 24 hours of placing the order.

PRIZE MONEY

If the IRS has notified us of a discrepancy in Payee name or SSN / EIN, prize money will be withheld until the discrepancy is resolved. Checks will be mailed or hand-delivered within 30 days after the Show.
- Prize Money Won by Foreign Exhibitors is subject to the US Internal Revenue Service regulation requiring sporting events to withhold 30% of prize money.

- High Performance Fees: Horses entered in Grand Prix are required to pay the \$35 IHP Fee up to a total of the cap of \$420 per competition year. Please refer to the USEF website for additional information.
- Horse/Pony Measurement Card: Junior Hunters, Pony Hunters, Children's Pony Hunters, and Pony Jumpers must have a valid USEF Measurement Card or copy of a valid Measurement Form, or be measured.
- Official Measurements are available at the show, to be held every Friday at 3:00pm. Please sign up in the show office.
- USEF Horse Recording: Horses must be Recorded with USEF Annually or for Life in order to be eligible for HOTY Awards and/or Zone Awards.
- USHJA Horse Registrations: All horses competing in USEF licensed Hunter/Jumper/Eq competitions must have or obtain a Registration Number from USHJA. PRESENTATION OF CREDENTIALS: THE SHOW SECRETARY WILL NOT ISSUE A NUMBER TO ANY EXHIBITOR UNTIL ASSOCIATION REQUIREMENTS HAVE BEEN MET. ONCE THE NUMBER IS ISSUED, ASSOCIATION FEES, INCLUDING SHOW PASS, WILL NOT BE ADJUSTED FOR THAT SHOW. Failure to provide proper credentials will result in show pass fees and/or Incomplete Entry fees charged in each incident. NOTE: The Exhibitor has the ultimate responsibility for proper registration of horse, owner, rider and trainer with USEF / USHJA and for entering the horse under proper ownership where points are concerned.
- Membership: Present to the Show Secretary proof of current membership, join at the show, or pay Show Pass fees.
- Horse Recording: Present to the Show Secretary proof of USHJA or apply at the Show. Horses must be Recorded with USEF Annually or for Life in order to be eligible for HOTY Awards and/or Zone Awards and to compete in a Grand Prix.
- Horse/Pony Measurement Card: Present to the Show Secretary proof of Measurement or have horse/pony measured at the Show.

CREDIT CARDS

- A declined credit card will be resubmitted and charged a \$50 declined credit card fee. Returned checks will be charged a \$50 returned check fee.
- A closed account, stop payment, incorrect or incomplete credit card information or a charge back will be turned over to sanctioning organizations immediately.
- A 3% Retail Adjustment will be applied to all Credit Card transactions.

HEALTH & VETERINARY

- Sharps & Medical Waste must be placed in the proper receptacles. Anyone found in violation shall be subject to a fine or other penalties deemed necessary by Show Management.
- Show Veterinarian is in residence on the show grounds. The Vet's phone number will be posted at the Show Office.
- Equine Health Requirements will be enforced. All horses (competing or not) that enter the grounds are required to present the Required Health Entry Requirements, including the Event Participation Declaration and Proof of Vaccination. All horses are be subject to examination by NEE officials/designated representatives and/or state officials (collectively "officials") for determining whether such animals are, have been infected/exposed, or are likely to become infected with an infectious or contagious disease. If after such examination, officials have reason to believe that an animal's health condition places other animals at risk, such officials, at their sole discretion, may quarantine such animal (and others that may have been infected/exposed) or, if appropriate, require that such animals be transported off the grounds. All participants agree to fully cooperate with event officials and abide by their decisions and instructions. Failure to comply shall be grounds for immediate expulsion and potential disciplinary action by organization, state/local or federal animal health officials. All exhibitors are encouraged to review the equine health entry/transport requirements of the destination state prior to entry. Additional information can be obtained from the State Vet Office.

By entering this horse show, you agree to these terms.

- We are committed to maintaining a transparent and complete record of each competitor's performance. As part of this commitment, all video footage captured during competition will remain available for viewing online.
- Please note that we only remove or withhold video clips in the event of a confirmed rider or horse injury where a steward filed a report to USEF. This policy is in place out of respect for the individuals involved and to prioritize their privacy.

SAFETY

Accidents Involving Competitors. GR1317. In the event of a head injury due to a fall/accident at a licensed competition, the competitor may be prohibited from further competition until released by medical personnel. In some cases, the competitor may not return to competition without a signed release from a licensed medical professional. The competitor may be placed on suspension by USEF until this criteria is met. Competitors are advised to familiarize themselves with this new rule.

- **Protective Headgear:** It is compulsory for all persons at Federation licensed hunter, jumper or hunter/jumper competitions in all Hunter, Jumper and Hunt Seat Equitation classes, when mounted anywhere on the competition grounds, to wear properly fastened protective headgear which meets or exceeds ASTM (American Society for Testing and Materials)/SEI (Safety Equipment Institute) standards for equestrian use and carries the SEI tag. It must be properly fitted with harness secured. It is the responsibility of the rider, or the parent or guardian or trainer of the junior exhibitor to see to it that the headgear worn complies with appropriate safety standards for protective headgear intended for equestrian use, and is properly fitted and in good condition, and the Federation, Show Committee and Licensed Official are not responsible for checking headgear worn for such compliance. GR 801.2.7.
- **Minors who do not have a valid driver's license** which allows them to operate a motorized vehicle in the state in which they reside will not be permitted to operate a motorized vehicle of any kind, including, but not limited to, golf carts, motorcycles, scooters, or farm utility vehicles, on the competition grounds of licensed competitions. Minors who have a valid temporary license may operate the above described motorized vehicles as long as they are accompanied by an adult with a valid driver's license. The parent/legal guardian or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating a motorized vehicle in violation of this rule are solely responsible for any damages, claims, losses or actions resulting from that operation. Violations of this rule will be cause for penalties against those responsible for the child committing the offense. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.
- **The unsafe use of personal electronic transport devices**, as determined by the competition officials and management in their sole discretion, that do not require a driver's license to operate, including but not limited to segways, hover boards, and single wheeled scooters is prohibited on competition grounds. Operating such devices in areas where people gather may be deemed "unsafe use" if there is a risk of harm to others. If the operator of the device is a minor, the parent/legal guardian or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating the device in violation of this rule is accountable and may be subject to penalties.

Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.

- **Dogs must be restrained on the show grounds:** Loose dogs will be picked up and detained and the owner fined \$100. The owner may be barred from showing and expelled from the show grounds for a second offense, or for refusal to pay the fine, and will not be entitled to any refund of entry or stabling fees paid or due. Management reserves the right to call Animal Control to have an animal removed from the premises.
- **Electrical/Fire Regulations:** Electrical installation and connections must meet all state and county codes. Aisles shall be maintained clear for a minimum of six feet wide by eight feet high. No obstructions or projections shall be allowed in these aisles. No Class I Flammable Liquids such as gasoline are allowed inside the buildings. Cooking is not permitted within any stable area. Anyone found in violation shall be subject to dismissal from further participation in the horse show without recourse. Additional appliances are not permitted within any stable area. Anyone found in violation shall be subject to confiscation of the item(s).
- **Exterior Tent alterations** are strictly forbidden. The removal of stall tent side poles, side ropes and/or stakes/anchors is strictly prohibited. Any exhibitor found in violation will be issued a single warning. If violation continues, Management reserves the right to remove from the show grounds all property belonging to or under the control of said violator. Further, Management reserves the right to bar any exhibitor found to be in violation from any further participation in the horse show without recourse to any refund of entry or stabling fees paid or due.
- **Damage:** Owners and exhibitors shall be held responsible for damage caused by them, their agents or employees to stalls, buildings and other properties on the show grounds, and shall be billed accordingly.
- **Alcoholic Beverages** in any form may not be brought onto the show grounds.

GENERAL

Poling: Poling is prohibited in the State of California.

Entries May Close: Trainers and Exhibitors are advised that Management may elect to exercise its right to close entries for certain classes. Exhibitors are advised to keep this in mind when submitting their original Entry Form.

Show Weeks May Close: Exhibitors are advised that some show weeks may sell out. After the Closing Date of Entries, priority is given to exhibitors who enter two or more show weeks.

Awards: Ribbons will be awarded for 1st–8th placings. International Riders: All classes held will be run under National rules with regard to riders with the exception of the FEI classes, when applicable. If the capacity of International riders exceeds the National riders rule, riders will be accepted on a 1st come, 1st served basis.

HUNTERS

General: All classes in rated hunter divisions will be judged on performance and soundness and when indicated, conformation, suitability or manners.

Jog: The following sections will not jog: Schooling, Low, Young, Adult, Children's, Short Stirrup, Long Stirrup, Cross Rails, and Green Rider. In divisions where horses are required to jog, horses are expected to circle on a loose rein to prove soundness.

Hunter Champion and Reserve: Awarded to two of the four horses scoring the most points over fences. In addition, only these will receive full points for ribbons won under saddle and half points for ribbons won in the model. In case of a tie, the horse who earned more points over fences wins the championship.

Warm-Up: Complimentary Warm up on on day prior to start of the show from 9 AM – 5 PM in our sand hunter arenas.

Cross Entry Restrictions:

Mod Child/Adult Hunter – no cross entry 3'3 or higher

Green Rider – no cross entry 2'9" or higher (exception: class 776 \$500 Child/Adult Hunter Derby)

Short/Long stirrup – no cross entry 2'3 or higher (exception: Children's Pony Hunter & Rated Pony)

Cross Rail – many not cross enter into any other classes

JUMPERS

Jumper Nomination Fee: \$125

Nominated Jumper Sections: 1.20m – 1.45m, Grand Prix, Jr/Am Jumper 1.20m–1.45m.

Non-Nominated Jumper Sections: .70m–1.15m, Jr/Am Jumper 1m–1.15m.

Jumper Champion and Reserve: Classics will not count towards Champion and Reserve Champion. However, in case of a tie, the placing in the corresponding Classic will break all ties. For nominated jumpers, money won will determine Champion and Reserve.

Eligibility: Any horse, regardless of winnings, is eligible to enter any .70m–1.45m and Open Jumper class.

Declarations: Nominated Jumpers must declare on the appropriate form in the Show Office by 4 pm the day before the class is to be held. Late declarations will be subject to the Post Entry Penalty and may require the horse to work first or last in the order of go at management's discretion. Classes may be scratched the day of prior to the class starting with no penalty – exception: Special Classes. Classes entered on the Entry Blank constitute a Declaration.

Jumper Tables: Refer to the Time Schedule.

Time Allowed: The Time Allowed will be based on a speed of 382 yards per minute for all sections unless otherwise noted, and may be adjusted accordingly.

Martingales: 1.30m or below: No martingale restrictions when used in a conventional manner. Draw Rein/German Martingales: allowed when schooling or in classes 1.20m or below that do not offer prize money. Above 1.30m (and all classes restricted to young horses): Only running martingales used in the conventional manner. Note: Ponies may not be ridden by a Junior in draw reins or German martingales at any time.

Ties: Ties involving first place will be jumped off. Ties not involving first place will be decided upon time unless otherwise stated.

24 Hour Rule: Horses must be stabled on the grounds 24 hours prior to any class with prize money of \$25,000 or more. 2024 Zone 10 Specifications: (Check USHJA.org for the most updated specs.)

SPECIAL CLASSES

The General Rules and Regulations of the Horse Show will prevail for the Special Classes except as provided for each individual class and as noted herein.

National Standard Grand Prix –

- 1.45m – 1.50m with spreads to 1.70m, excluding Triple Bar and the first fence on course. At least 4 Verticals and 2 Oxers must be set at 1.50m. The maximum spread for the Triple Bar is 2.00m.
- Specs: Table II.2.a. National Standard.
- Horse Limit: Riders are not limited to the number of horses they may ride.

Special Hunter Classics: Judged on performance and soundness with manners and suitability emphasized. To be scored under the open numerical judging system. The top 12 (or 1/3) horses (ponies) from the first round will return to jump a second round in reverse order of their scores in the first round; lowest score going first and highest score going last. In case of ties, order of those tied will be drawn. Scores will be averaged from both rounds to determine the winners. In case of a tie for first place only, judges will confer to break the tie. All other ties will remain and riders will toss a coin for the ribbons.

- **Separate Two Round Classic** – For the first round, each competitor will jump one round of approximately 10–12 fences at the required height.
- **Designated First Round Classic** – A designated class of the Division will be the first round of the Classic. You must enter the Classic prior to the start of the first round class. Scratches are not permitted after the First round class has begun. See Time Schedule for Designated First round class.

Special Class Nomination/Declaration: Special Classes added on the day of or after the Order of Go has been drawn will be required to work first in the order.

Special Class Scratch: Any scratch must be made before the class starts. See Rules & Regulations for more information.

- Classics / Grand Prix: In the event of scratch on the day of the class, horses are subject to the Classic / Grand Prix Scratch Fee.

Order of Go: The Order of Go will be drawn. In the jump-off, if any, all horses will go in the original drawn order

Attire: Formal attire required in Special Classes.

Awards: Winners to ride for presentation of awards in Special Classes.

Trophy & Ribbons: Ribbons will be awarded for 1st–10th placings.

Show Champion or Circuit Champion: Classics will not count toward Show or Circuit Champion

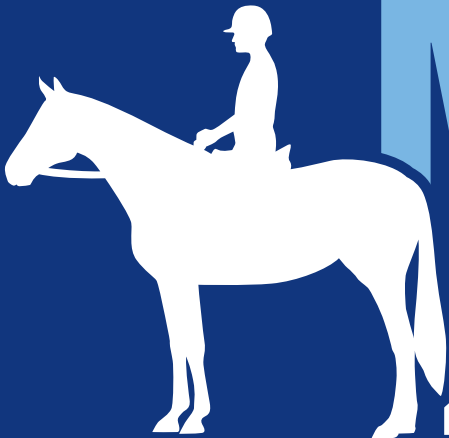
