

Horse show entries are FREE for Thoroughbreds (OTTBs) and young horses (6 and under) at select Temecula Valley National Horse Shows. Young Hunter class fees are waived all weeks. Thoroughbreds must be tattooed or microchipped with jockey papers and USEF age verification is required for young horses. Exhibitors are fully responsible for all additional charges, such as office, stall, feed and bedding, and USEF fees.

NOTE: Complimentary classes are limited to five (5) classes per horse per week.





WAIVER AND RELEASE OF LIABILITY, ASSUMPTION OF RISK AND INDEMNITY AGREEMENT

For and in consideration of United States Equestrian Federation, Inc. dba US Equestrian ("USEF") allowing me, the undersigned, to participate in any capacity (including as a rider, driver, handler, vaulter, longeur, lessee, owner, agent, coach, official, trainer or volunteer) in a USEF sanctioned, licensed or approved event or activity, including but not limited to equestrian clinics, practices, shows, competitions and related or incidental activities and

(“USEF Event” or “USEF Events”); I, for myself, and on behalf of my spouse, children, heirs and next of kin, and any legal and personal representatives, executors, administrators, successors, and assigns, hereby agree to and make the following contractual representations pursuant to this Agreement (the “Agreement”):

A. RULES AND REGULATIONS: I hereby agree that I have read, understand, and agree to be bound by all applicable Federation Bylaws, rules, and policies including the USEF Safe Sport Policy and Minor Athlete Abuse Prevention Policies (MAAPP) as published at www.usef.org, as amended from time to time.

B. ACKNOWLEDGMENT OF INHERENT RISKS: I understand and acknowledge that equine activities, including but not limited to horseback riding and equestrian sport, are rugged adventure recreational sports and I knowingly, willingly, and voluntarily acknowledge the inherent risks associated with equine activities and know that these activities are inherently dangerous, and that participation in any USEF Event involves risks and dangers including, without limitation, the potential for serious bodily injury (including broken bones, head or neck injuries), sickness and disease (including communicable diseases), trauma, pain & suffering, permanent disability, paralysis and death; loss of or damage to personal property (including my mount & equipment) arising out of the unpredictable behavior of horses; exposure to extreme conditions and circumstances; accidents involving other participants, event staff, volunteers or spectators; contact or collision with other participants and horses, natural or manmade objects; adverse weather conditions; facilities issues and premises conditions; failure of protective equipment (including helmets); inadequate safety measures; participants of varying skill levels; situations beyond the immediate control of the USEF Event organizers and competition management; and other undefined, not readily foreseeable and presently unknown risks and dangers (“Risks”).

EQUINE ACTIVITY LIABILITY ACT WARNING:

CAUTION: HORSEBACK RIDING AND EQUINE ACTIVITIES CAN BE DANGEROUS. RIDE AT YOUR OWN RISK.

Under the laws of most States, an equine activity sponsor or equine professional is not liable for any injury to, or the death of, a participant in equine activities resulting from the inherent risks of equine activities.

C. ASSUMPTION OF RISK: I understand that the aforementioned Risks may be caused in whole or in part or result directly or indirectly from the negligence of my own actions or inactions, the actions or inactions of others participating in the USEF Events, or the negligent acts or omissions of the Released Parties defined below, and I hereby voluntarily and knowingly assume all such Risks and responsibility for any damages, liabilities, losses, or expenses that I incur as a result of my participation in any USEF Events. I also agree to be responsible for any injury or damage caused by me, my horse, my employees or contractors under my direction and control at any USEF Event.

D. WAIVER AND RELEASE OF LIABILITY, HOLD HARMLESS AND INDEMNITY: In conjunction with my participation in any USEF Event, I hereby release, waive and covenant not to sue, and further agree to indemnify, defend and hold harmless the following parties: USEF, USEF Recognized Affiliate Associations, the United States Olympic & Paralympic Committee (USOPC), USEF clubs, members, Event participants (including athletes/riders, coaches, trainers, judges/officials, and other personnel), the Event owner, licensee, and competition managers; the promoters, sponsors, or advertisers of any USEF Event; any charity or other beneficiary which may benefit from the USEF Event; the owners, managers, or lessors of any facilities or premises where a USEF Event may be held; and all directors, officers, employees, agents, contractors, and volunteers of any of the aforementioned parties (**Individually and Collectively, the “Released Parties” or “Event Organizers”**), with respect to any liability, claim(s), demand(s), cause(s) of action, damage(s), loss, or expense (including court costs and reasonable attorney fees) of any kind or nature (“**Liability**”) which may arise out of, result from, or relate in any way to my participation in the USEF Events, including claims for Liability caused in whole or in part by the negligent acts or omissions of the Released Parties.

E. COMPLETE AGREEMENT AND SEVERABILITY CLAUSE: This Agreement represents the complete understanding between the parties regarding these issues and no oral representations, statements or inducements have been made apart from this Agreement. If any provision of this Agreement is held to be unlawful, void, or for any reason unenforceable, then that provision shall be deemed severable from this Agreement and shall not affect the validity and enforceability of any remaining provisions.

I HAVE CAREFULLY READ THIS DOCUMENT IN ITS ENTIRETY, UNDERSTAND ALL OF ITS TERMS AND CONDITIONS, AND KNOW IT CONTAINS AN ASSUMPTION OF RISK, RELEASE AND WAIVER FROM LIABILITY, AS WELL AS A HOLD HARMLESS AND INDEMNIFICATION OBLIGATIONS.

(the "Federation") and the local rules of _____ (Competition). I agree to be bound by the Bylaws and Rules of the Federation and of the competition. I will accept as final the decision of the Hearing Committee on any question arising under the Rules, and agree to release and hold harmless the competition, the Federation, their officials, directors and employees for any action taken under the Rules. I represent that I am eligible to enter and/or participate under the Rules, and every horse I am entering is eligible as entered. I also agree that as a condition of and in consideration of acceptance of entry, the Federation and/or the Competition may use or assign photographs, videos, audios, cable - casts, broadcasts, internet, film, new media or other likenesses of me and my horse taken during the course of the competition for the promotion, coverage or benefit of the competition, sport, or the Federation. Those likenesses shall not be used to advertise a product and they may not be used in such a way as to jeopardize amateur status. I hereby expressly and irrevocably waive and release any rights in connection with such use, including any claim to compensation, invasion of privacy, right of publicity, or to misappropriation. The construction and application of Federation rules are governed by the laws of the State of New York, and any action instituted against the Federation must be filed in New York State. See GR908.4.

No entry will be accepted without the signature of parent or guardian on the entry form. The signatures of instructors, agents, or other unrelated persons will not be accepted.

"EVERY CLASS OFFERED HEREIN WHICH IS COVERED BY THE RULES AND SPECIFICATIONS OF THE CURRENT USEF RULEBOOK WILL BE CONDUCTED AND JUDGED IN ACCORDANCE THEREWITH."

CONDITIONS OF COMPETITION

Eventing Competitions at the Modified Level or above, Combined Driving Competitions at the Advanced Level, Dressage Competitions, Endurance Rides and Vaulting Competitions: (See GR828.4 of the Federation rules). Life, senior active and junior active members shall be eligible to participate in all classes at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions at the Modified Level or above and Combined Driving Competitions at the Advanced Level, Dressage, Reining and Vaulting Competitions and Endurance Rides. A non-member may participate as a handler, rider, driver, owner, lessee, or agent, at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions, Dressage Competitions, Reining Competitions and Combined Driving Competitions upon payment of a Show Pass fee. Participants in the following classes are exempted from the Requirements of this rule: 1) deadline; 2) exhibitions; 3) games and races; 4) classes for 4-H members; 5) walk trot (exception: Friesian performance FR231) and academy classes (academy classes are classes limited to horses used regularly in a lesson program); 6) USDF introductory level tests, pas de deux and quadrille classes; 7) NRHA Endorsed Reining Competitions. 8) Opportunity classes, 9) citizens of other nations who have proof, in English, of current membership in good standing of their own National Federation, 10) USEA beginner novice division; and 11) assistant handlers in Dressage Sport Horse Breeding classes.

I will accept as final the decision of the Hearing Committee on any question arising under the Rules, and agree to release and hold harmless the competition, the Federation, their officials, directors and employees for any action taken under the Rules. I represent that I am eligible to enter and/or participate under the rules, and every horse I am entering is eligible as entered. I also agree that as a condition of and in consideration of acceptance of entry,

the Federation and/or the competition may use or assign photographs, videos, audios, cablecasts, broadcasts, internet, film, news media or other likenesses of me and my horse taken during the course of the competition for the promotion, coverage or benefit of the competition, sport, or the Federation. Those likenesses shall not be used to advertise a product and they may not be used in such a way as to jeopardize amateur status. I hereby expressly and irrevocably waive and release any rights in connection with such use, including any claim to compensation, invasion of privacy, right of publicity, or to misappropriation. The construction and application of Federation rules are governed by the laws of the State of New York, and any action instituted against the Federation must be filed in New York State. See GR 908.4.

The Horse Show Committee reserves the right to itself to interpret all questions and conditions in regard to or arising out of, or incident to the show without claims for damages or recourse of any kind. All questions not covered in these Rules and Regulations shall be decided by the Horse Show Management; its decision to be final. The Horse Show Management reserves to itself the right to limit entries in any class, section or division, to refuse, accept conditionally, or to cancel any entries, disqualify any riders or exhibitors, prohibit exhibition of entries, and cancel award prizes, without any claim for damages; to change any course, to add a dotted line, to cancel or combine any unfilled classes, or to reschedule classes, after due notice to exhibitors; to change rings or rotate judges; to change specifications in jumper classes as competition warrants.

Every horse entered herein for competition will be under the control of the Horse Show Management, but the Show Management will in no case be responsible for any loss or damage that may occur, and it shall be a condition of entry that each exhibitor shall hold the horse show and the officials, employees, directors, officers, sponsoring entities of the horse show and the facilities at which the horse show is held blameless for any loss or accident to his horse(s), employee(s), or equipment which may occur from sickness, fire or other cause.

ENTRY CLOSING DATE: Must be RECEIVED by date indicated on entry blank.

A 3% charge will be added to all fees paid by credit card.

ENTRY PROCEDURE

- Fees must be paid using a credit card. No cash or checks will be accepted.
- Visa, Master Card, & American Express are accepted.
- Horse Deposit Fee and all other applicable fees on the Entry must be submitted with the Entry or the Entry will be considered Late. Any partial payment will be applied to later week entries.
- Horse Deposit Fee will be credited to the horse's entries only if the Entry is received by the Closing Date and meets the Entry Procedure.
- Entries received after the Closing Date will be late and subject to the Post Entry Penalty.
- Accounts must be closed at the end of each show week. Management will close Exhibitor Accounts that have not been settled at the conclusion of each show.
- Billing questions or refunds will not be considered after two weeks following the conclusion of the show.
- Back numbers will not be issued until previous week balances are closed.
- Exhibitors must close out their account online through ShowGroundsLive. Exhibitors who do not close out by the Monday following each show automatically authorize NEE to close their account using the Credit Card on file. Billing questions or refunds will not be considered. Should you have any questions or concerns with your bill, please call the horse show office directly.
- The Horse Show policies herein stated regarding scratches and refunds will be followed regardless of weather and in place of GR 912.
- Receipt of any entry form to NEE, whether bearing signature or not, will constitute an entry and will be subject to the Rules and Regulations of this prize list.
- Accounts that are not closed out by Monday following each show week by 5:00pm will incur a \$75 late close-out fee.
- **RETURNED CHECKS/CHARGEBACKS:** Checks returned by the bank or Credit card chargebacks for any reason are regarded as a most serious offense and will be handled according to the following procedure: A \$75 penalty will be assessed for each returned check or chargeback OR 10% of the face value of the check or chargeback, whichever is greater. Accounts will be given ten (10) days to be paid in full with cash or cash equivalent or they will be reported to the U.S. Equestrian Federation, Inc., PCHA and other appropriate association(s) for further disciplinary action. Checks will not be deposited a second time. In the case that the debt is not cleared within 30 days of the conclusion of the show, all prize money will be forfeited.

TRAINER'S BARN ACCOUNT

- Accounts that are not closed out by Monday following each show week by 5:00pm will incur a \$75 late close out fee.
- Trainer Splits must be done by 12:00pm on Friday.

ENTRY CLARIFICATION

- Classes may only be entered or declared by using a Class Number. A Class Number written on the Entry Form, Add/Scratch Form, or Barn Add/Scratch Form constitutes a Class Entry or Class Declaration.
- An entry with incomplete information for horse, owner, rider or trainer such as a horse entered as "Entry" or "TBA" or any such derivative, will be subject to the \$75 Incomplete Entry Fee. An entry with missing USEF/USHJA numbers or signatures is also subject to this fee.
- Equitation riders must ride the horse and wear the number of the horse they have entered to ride. There is no penalty for the rider to scratch an equitation class from one horse and add it on another horse. Exhibitors who enter an equitation class on one horse and ride or wear another horse's number will be charged on both horses.
- Any exhibitor who does not compete in a class in which he/she is officially entered, and does not scratch according to the Scratch Procedures outlined below, will be billed for the class.
- Horses shown in a class without being officially entered will be assessed a penalty as shown below
- Exhibitors are responsible for a knowledge of the Rules and Regulations governing the horse show and for their own errors and omissions. In the case of a violation of a cross entry restriction, the exhibitor will forfeit the entry fee, class placing and prize money awards.
- Show means the Show Week.

POST ENTRY FEES

- Entry received after the Closing Date \$75
- Entry made after the Show starts \$150
- Incomplete Entry \$75 (See Entry Clarification above)

ADD/SCRATCH/CHANGE: Any complete Show Scratch must be made in writing in the Show Office on an official form, by letter, or via email, and received prior to the start of the applicable class or show. Scratching a class "at the gate" does not constitute an official scratch. Once a class or division begins, it may not be scratched, except for a Vet Scratch. If a Vet Scratch, the horse must be scratched in the Show Office on the day of the class and the Official Show Vet's Certificate must be received that day. Scratch Fee will still apply. A class that has been closed may not be scratched.

PRESENTATION OF CREDENTIALS: THE SHOW SECRETARY WILL NOT ISSUE A NUMBER TO ANY EXHIBITOR UNTIL ASSOCIATION REQUIREMENTS HAVE BEEN MET. ONCE THE NUMBER IS ISSUED, ASSOCIATION FEES, INCLUDING SHOW PASS, WILL NOT BE ADJUSTED FOR THAT SHOW. Failure to provide proper credentials will result in show pass fees and/or Incomplete Entry fees charged in each incident. NOTE: The Exhibitor has the ultimate responsibility for proper registration of horse, owner, rider and trainer with USEF / USHJA and for entering the horse under proper ownership where points are concerned.
- Membership: Present to the Show Secretary proof of current membership, join at the show, or pay Show Pass fees.
- Horse Recording: Present to the Show Secretary proof of USHJA or apply at the Show. Horses must be Recorded with USEF Annually or for Life in order to be eligible for HOTY Awards and/or Zone Awards and to compete in a Grand Prix.
- Horse/Pony Measurement Card: Present to the Show Secretary proof of Measurement or have horse/pony measured at the Show.

CREDIT CARDS

- A declined credit card will be resubmitted and charged a \$50 declined credit card fee. Returned checks will be charged a \$75 returned check fee.
- A closed account, stop payment, incorrect or incomplete credit card information or a charge back will be turned over to sanctioning organizations immediately.
- A 3% Retail Adjustment will be applied to all Credit Card transactions.

HEALTH & VETERINARY

- Sharps & Medical Waste must be placed in the proper receptacles. Anyone found in violation shall be subject to a fine or other penalties deemed necessary by Show Management.
- Show Veterinarian is in residence on the show grounds. The Vet's phone number will be posted at the Show Office.
- Equine Health Requirements will be enforced. All horses (competing or not) that enter the grounds are required to present the Required Health Entry Requirements, including the Event Participation Declaration and Proof of Vaccination All horses are be subject to examination by NEE officials/designated representatives and/or state officials (collectively "officials") for determining whether such animals are, have been infected/exposed, or are likely to become infected with an infectious or contagious disease. If after such examination, officials have reason to believe that an animal's health condition places other animals at risk, such officials, at their sole discretion, may quarantine such animal (and others that may have been infected/exposed) or, if appropriate, require that such animals be transported off the grounds. All participants agree to fully cooperate with event officials and abide by their decisions and instructions. Failure to comply shall be grounds for immediate expulsion and potential disciplinary action by organization, state/local or federal animal health officials. All exhibitors are encouraged to review the equine health entry/transport requirements of the destination state prior to entry. Additional information can be obtained from the State Vet Office.

VIDEO & MEDIA POLICY

By entering this horse show, you agree to these terms.

- We are committed to maintaining a transparent and complete record of each competitor's performance. As part of this commitment, all video footage captured during competition will remain available for viewing online.
- Please note that we only remove or withhold video clips in the event of a confirmed rider or horse injury where a steward filed a report to USEF. This policy is in place out of respect for the individuals involved and to prioritize their privacy.

SAFETY

Accidents Involving Competitors. GR1317. In the event of a head injury due to a fall/accident at a licensed competition, the competitor may be prohibited from further competition until released by medical personnel. In some cases, the competitor may not return to competition without a signed release from a licensed medical professional. The competitor may be placed on suspension by USEF until this criteria is met. Competitors are advised to familiarize themselves with this new rule.

- Protective Headgear: It is compulsory for all persons at Federation licensed hunter, jumper or hunter/jumper competitions in all Hunter, Jumper and Hunt Seat Equitation classes, when mounted anywhere on the competition grounds, to wear properly fastened protective headgear which meets or exceeds ASTM (American Society for Testing and Materials)/SEI (Safety Equipment Institute) standards for equestrian use and carries the SEI tag. It must be properly fitted with harness secured. It is the responsibility of the rider, or the parent or guardian or trainer of the junior exhibitor to see to it that the headgear worn complies with appropriate safety standards for protective headgear intended for equestrian use, and is properly fitted and in good condition, and the Federation, Show Committee and Licensed Official are not responsible for checking headgear worn for such compliance. GR 801.2.7.
- Minors who do not have a valid driver's license which allows them to operate a motorized vehicle in the state in which they reside will not be permitted to operate a motorized vehicle of any kind, including, but not limited to, golf carts, motorcycles, scooters, or farm utility vehicles, on the competition grounds of licensed competitions. Minors who have a valid temporary license may operate the above described motorized vehicles as long as they are accompanied by an adult with a valid driver's license. The parent/legal guardian or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating a motorized vehicle in violation of this rule are solely responsible for any damages, claims, losses or actions resulting from that operation. Violations of this rule will be cause for penalties against those responsible for the child committing the offense. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.
- The unsafe use of personal electronic transport devices, as determined by the competition officials and management in their sole discretion, that do not require a driver's license to operate, including but not limited to segways, hover boards, and single wheeled scooters is prohibited on competition grounds. Operating such devices in areas where people gather may be deemed "unsafe use" if there is a risk of harm to others. If the operator of the device is a minor, the parent/legal guardian or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating the device in violation of this rule is accountable and may be subject to penalties.

Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.

- Dogs must be restrained on the show grounds: Loose dogs will be picked up and detained and the owner fined \$100. The owner may be barred from showing and expelled from the show grounds for a second offense, or for refusal to pay the fine, and will not be entitled to any refund of entry or stabling fees paid or due. Management reserves the right to call Animal Control to have an animal removed from the premises.
- Electrical/Fire Regulations: Electrical installation and connections must meet all state and county codes. Aisles shall be maintained clear for a minimum of six feet wide by eight feet high. No obstructions or projections shall be allowed in these aisles. No Class I Flammable Liquids such as gasoline are allowed inside the buildings. Cooking is not permitted within any stable area. Anyone found in violation shall be subject to dismissal from further participation in the horse show without recourse. Additional appliances are not permitted within any stable area. Anyone found in violation shall be subject to cancellation of the item(s).
- Exterior Tent alterations are strictly forbidden. The removal of stall tent side poles, side ropes and/or stakes/anchors is strictly prohibited. Any exhibitor found in violation will be issued a single warning. If violation continues, Management reserves the right to remove from the show grounds all property belonging to or under the control of said violator. Further, Management reserves the right to bar any exhibitor found to be in violation from any further participation in the horse show without recourse to any refund of entry or stabling fees paid or due.
- Damage: Owners and exhibitors shall be held responsible for damage caused by them, their agents or employees to stalls, buildings and other properties on the show grounds, and shall be billed accordingly.
- Alcoholic Beverages in any form may not be brought onto the show grounds.

Entries May Close: Trainers and Exhibitors are advised that Management may elect to exercise its right to close entries for certain classes. Exhibitors are advised to keep this in mind when submitting their original Entry Form.

Show Weeks May Close: Exhibitors are advised that some show weeks may sell out. After the Closing Date of Entries, priority is given to exhibitors who enter two or more show weeks.

Awards: Ribbons will be awarded for 1st-8th placings. **International Riders:** All classes held will be run under National rules with regard to riders with the exception of the FEI classes, when applicable. If the capacity of International riders exceeds the National riders rule, riders will be accepted on a 1st come, 1st served basis.

HUNTERS

General: All classes in rated hunter divisions will be judged on performance and soundness and when indicated, conformation, suitability or manners.

Jog: The following sections will not jog: Schooling, USHJA, Young, Adult, Children's, Short Stirrup, Long Stirrup, Cross Rails, and Green Rider. In divisions where horses are required to jog, horses are expected to circle on a loose rein to prove soundness.

Hunter Champion and Reserve: Awarded to two of the four horses scoring the most points over fences. In addition, only these will receive full points for ribbons won under saddle and half points for ribbons won in the model. In case of a tie, the horse who earned more points over fences wins the championship.

Warm-Up: Complimentary Warm up on day prior to start of the show from 9 AM - 5 PM in our sand hunter arenas.

Cross Entry Restrictions:

Mod Child/Adult Hunter - no cross entry 3'3 or higher

Green Rider - no cross entry 2'9" or higher (exception: class 776 \$500 Child/Adult Hunter Derby)

Short/Long stirrup - no cross entry 2'3 or higher
(exception: Children's Pony Hunter & Rated Pony)

Cross Rail - many not cross enter into any other classes

JUMPERS

Jumper Nomination Fee: \$100

Nominated Jumper Sections: 1.20m – 1.45m, Grand Prix, Jr/Am Jumper 1.20m-1.45m.

Non-Nominated Jumper Sections:
.70m-1.15m, Jr/Am Jumper 1m-1.15m.

Jumper Champion and Reserve: Classics will not count towards Champion and Reserve Champion. However, in case of a tie, the placing in the corresponding Classic will break all ties. For nominated jumpers, money won will determine Champion and Reserve.

Eligibility: Any horse, regardless of winnings, is eligible to enter any .70m-1.45m and Open Jumper class.

Declarations: Nominated Jumpers must declare on the appropriate form in the Show Office by 4 pm the day before the class is to be held. Late declarations will be subject to the Post Entry Penalty and may require the horse to work first or last in the order of go at management's discretion. Classes may be scratched the day of prior to the class starting with no penalty – exception: Special Classes. Classes entered on the Entry Blank constitute a Declaration.

Jumper Tables: Refer to the Time Schedule.

Time Allowed: The Time Allowed will be based on a speed of 382 yards per minute for all sections unless otherwise noted, and may be adjusted accordingly.

Martingales: 1.30m or below: No martingale restrictions when used in a conventional manner. Draw Rein/German Martingales: allowed when schooling or in classes 1.20m or below that do not offer prize money. Above 1.30m (and all classes restricted to young horses): Only running martingales used in the conventional manner. Note: Ponies may not be ridden by a Junior in draw reins or German martingales at any time.

Ties: Ties involving first place will be jumped off. Ties not involving first place will be decided upon time unless otherwise stated.

24 Hour Rule: Horses must be stabled on the grounds 24 hours prior to any class with prize money of \$25,000 or more. 2026 Zone 10 Specifications: (Check USHJA.org for the most updated specs.)

SPECIAL CLASSES

The General Rules and Regulations of the Horse Show will prevail for the Special Classes except as provided for each individual class and as noted herein.

National Standard Grand Prix -

- 1.45m - 1.50m with spreads to 1.70m, excluding Triple Bar and the first fence on course. At least 4 Verticals and 2 Oxers must be set at 1.50m. The maximum spread for the Triple Bar is 2.00m.
- Specs: Table II.2.a. National Standard.
- Horse Limit: Riders are not limited to the number of horses they may ride.

Special Hunter Classics: Judged on performance and soundness with manners and suitability emphasized. To be scored under the open numerical judging system. The top 12 (or 1/3) horses (ponies) from the first round will return to jump a second round in reverse order of their scores in the first round; lowest score going first and highest score going last. In case of ties, order of those tied will be drawn. Scores will be averaged from both rounds to determine the winners. In case of a tie for first place only, judges will confer to break the tie. All other ties will remain and riders will toss a coin for the ribbons.

- **Separate Two Round Classic** - For the first round, each competitor will jump one round of approximately 10-12 fences at the required height.
- **Designated First Round Classic** - A designated class of the Division will be the first round of the Classic. You must enter the Classic prior to the start of the first round class. Scratches are not permitted after the First round class has begun. See Time Schedule for Designated First round class.

Special Class Nomination/Declaration: Special Classes added on the day of or after the Order of Go has been drawn will be required to work first in the order.

Special Class Scratch: Any scratch must be made before the class starts. See Rules & Regulations for more information.

- **Classics / Grand Prix:** In the event of scratch on the day of the class, horses are subject to the Classic / Grand Prix Scratch Fee.

Order of Go: The Order of Go will be drawn. In the jump-off, if any, all horses will go in the original drawn order

Attire: Formal attire required in Special Classes.

Awards: Winners to ride for presentation of awards in Special Classes.

Trophy & Ribbons: Ribbons will be awarded for 1st-10th placings.

Show Champion or Circuit Champion: Classics will not count toward Show or Circuit Champion

EQUINE HEALTH ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

USEF VACCINATION RECORD (REQUIRED)

The USEF Vaccination Record form must be completed. The following information must be included: date of vaccination, place of vaccination, vaccine name, vaccine batch, and vaccine route mode. Form must be signed and stamped by attending veterinarian.

Within 6 months (180 days) of each show: **Equine Influenza**
Within 6 months (180 days) of each show: **EHV 1 and EHV 4**

If a vaccination will expire during one of the shows, the horse must receive its new vaccination prior to being issued a competition number for that show.



3 DAY TEMPERATURE LOG (RECOMMENDED)

TEMPERATURE LOG DURING SHOW (RECOMMENDED)

A 3 day temperature log, with temperatures taken twice per day, is recommended to be submitted for each horse 24 hours prior to arrival.


